## Monthly Review

#### **Unit of Inquiry:**

The learners inquired into the meaning of 'choice' and how choices that we have made affect our lifestyle. They further explored various aspects of wellbeing such as physical, emotional, intellectual, social and environmental through homeroom discussions, stories, hands-on learning engagement and guest talks. The inquiry helped them to understand that, apart from our body we need to take care of our emotions, mind, relationships and environment. For each aspect, they inquired into the key concept of causation, by learning about the cause and the effect of their choices towards each aspect of wellbeing. They learned about the key concept of responsibility by reflecting on the choices they make and the ways to maintain a healthy and balanced lifestyle. The geckos further explored sources of information, the various sources from which they get information and how these sources influence their point of views and choices. They also reflected upon the information, they get, are real or fake.

**Transdisciplinary Language**: The geckos practised reading various family words through the blending technique. They learned about the sight words: I, me, am, you, my, and practiced making sentences using them. They learned action words through various hands-on learning engagements.

Transdisciplinary Math: The geckos learned about ways to represent the number sequence, such as cardinal numbers and ordinal numbers. They also learned that data can be represented using tally marks and the bar graph helps in interpretation of data. Further, they had fun with comparison of numbers to understand the concept of greater than, lesser than and equal to. In addition to this, they were introduced to 'simple addition' for the numbers up to 10.

**Dance:** This month our geckos learned to dance using different props like *dandiya sticks*, streamers and pompoms. They learned different moves to the tune of the music using these props. They understood how props can enhance a dance performance.

**Music:** The geckos were given the choice of songs to learn in connection with the current unit of inquiry. The songs were based on the expression of happiness and excitement. They learned songs for Grandparent's Day as well.

Art: The geckos were introduced to elements of art — line, shape, and colour, which are the basics of art. The geckos made a colour wheel, which is an illustrative model of colour hues to show the relationship between primary and secondary colours. In connection with their present UOI, they were given a choice of material and an art form. They made their choice of drawing, using 'line, shape and colour, and mosaic collage' during their creative learning process. They also made eco-friendly Ganesh idols; they were made aware of the reason behind making eco-friendly Ganesh idols — to save environment by using eco-friendly material and to help one of the old-age homes contributing the amount raised from the sale of these idols.

**PE**: The geckos did warm-ups and cooling down activities. They improved their locomotive skills through various activities such as walking forward and backward on toes and heels, leaping, and walking on the spot markers. The geckos also engaged in basic warm-up activities like spot running with varying the speed, running between the soccer cones and the straight line and zig-zag walking.

## The Month Ahead

- Unit of Inquiry: We will begin with our new unit of inquiry under the theme, 'Where we are in place and time?' The geckos will be inquiring about artefacts and different types of artefacts. They will also be analysing artefacts using the 5 senses, the time period it was made in, the purpose it was made for and whether they should continue to preserve it in the future. The understanding and analysis of artefacts is to gain knowledge about our history.
- Transdisciplinary Language: The geckos will learn about positional words, naming words and how to use the articles, 'a', 'an' and 'the'. They will also learn antonyms and compound words. They will be introduced to basic tenses.
- Transdisciplinary Math: The geckos will explore various 2D and 3D shapes and learn their properties. They will also be introduced to the concept of timeline.
- Dance: The geckos will display their learning through performance. They will recognize the theme of a dance and communicate their personal interpretation and respond to the dance through spoken, written, visual and /or kinesthetic mediums. The geckos will develop physical balance and coordination through the dance.
- Music: The geckos will be practicing lyrics by singing and will learn the synchronisation between melody and rhythm pattern with the help of the accompanied musical instruments. They will also revise the songs so far learned.
- Art: The geckos will be learning about tints and shades and making crafts for Farmer's Market.
- PE: The geckos will continue to enhance their gross motor skills and spatial awareness by practising several forms of fundamental, movement activities.
