Unit of Inquiry:

The geckos continued their inquiry on personal abilities and interest through the various learning engagements. As part of the summative assessment they presented their scrap book on "All about myself". It gave an opportunity to exhibit their social and communication skills as well apart from their understanding of physical, social, emotional characteristics.

The geckos began with the third unit of inquiry under the transdisciplinary theme, 'Sharing the planet'. The prior-knowledge assessment was done to assess their understanding of the terms "living things and non-living things". They have begun exploring the characteristics of living things.

Transdisciplinary Language:

The geckos were introduced to the letter W,F,N through the term weight, friends, family and non-living things. The letters L, T, M, B, D, E, H, P, A were reinforced as well. They were also introduced to opposites in and out, lazy and active, long and short, hot and cold.

Transdisciplinary Math:

The geckos were introduced to the new shapes square and rectangle. They were also introduced to the concept patterns and pre- math concept big and small, up and down, tall and ascending order through the flash cards of human growth(small to big) i.e. baby, toddler, adult and old age.

Dance: The geckos were engaged in preparing for the Sports Day.

Music: The geckos learnt the songs, 'Peanut' and 'Bear'

Art: The geckos continued their inquiry on colours by segregating various things like beads, crayons, and colour pencils to identify the similar colours. They were introduced to the primary colours and were engaged in a brainstorming activity of recollecting various objects of primary colours. The geckos drew them to enhance their drawing skills and observation skills.

PE: The geckos were engaged in practicing for Circuit Training and races for the upcoming Sports Day. They developed their balancing, running and jumping skills by playing individual and team games like circuit training and team races.

Month Ahead

Unit of Inquiry: The geckos will further inquire about the needs of the living things like air, water, and food. They will learn how animals and humans obtain their food from plants and other animals, which provides them with the energy they need to move and grow.

Transdisciplinary Language:

The geckos will learn the remaining uppercase letters with the phonic sounds, days of the week and opposites. They will also engage in picture talk and building vocabulary.

Transdisciplinary Math:

The geckos will learn number 8 – 9 and will be introduced to number 10.

Dance: The geckos will have a reinforcement of basic movements, body postures with the help of props such as pompom and streamers.

Music: The geckos will learn the songs, 'Old Mc Donald' and 'If you're happy'.

Art: The geckos will continue to explore the colours through various learning engagements by mixing colours and making new colours.

PE: The geckos will continue with the Sports Day practice. They will later engage in physical activities involving striking, throwing and catching.
