Dear Parents,

In today's always-on, information-overloaded world, it can be hard for our learners to stay focused and balanced on their priorities to accomplish goals. How often are we distracted from inner chatter during our meetings? Or how often do we find that social media is pulling us away from more important work? However, if there's one secret to effectiveness, said leadership pioneer Peter Drucker, it's concentration. This is truer now than ever before.

The ability to apply a calm and clear focus on the tasks - at the right time, in the right way - is the key to exceptional results and performances. The primary task for our learners is to direct attention, whether during self-directed learning or during collaborative learning on the assigned tasks. The simple strategy to focus on is, thinking in one concept, while filtering out the distractions. But a wealth of recent research in neuroscience suggests that we focus on many ways, for different purposes, drawing on different neural pathways - some of which work in concert, while others tend to stand in opposition.

Grouping these modes of attention into three broad buckets - focusing on oneself, focus on others, and focus on the outer world - sheds new light on the practice of the essential learning skills. Every learner needs to cultivate this triad of awareness, in abundance and in the proper balance to develop physical, emotional, social and intellectual well being.
