Greetings from The Gaudium School!

- **Transdisciplinary Theme:**How we organize ourselves.
- **Central Idea:** Physical and virtual public spaces provide people with opportunities to make connections and establish a sense of community.
- Lines of Inquiry:

Unit of Inquiry :-

This month the inquiry focused on how people make an opportunity to connect and establish a sense of community within both the physical as well as virtual public space. As a regular process we used multiple mechanisms to reinforce the theme and also drive home the point about physical and virtual spaces.

Our first method was provocation. When subjected to provocation students were able to distinguish between public and private places and also list the differences between them. Subsequently they came up with virtual spaces like WhatsApp, Face book, Twitter and so on. They were able to list reasons on why public spaces are important. When they investigated further, they were able to underline the differences between a public place and a public space. We also had a session where there was a debate among students who spoke "for and against" the physical and virtual public space. During the exercise, they framed questions and collected information to know more about virtual space. Besides this they also enhanced their knowledge about virtual space through guest talks.

They were introduced to the virtual space, through a Gaudium walk through video. Similarly, a video was also used to inform them about the characteristics of a public space. After the viewing they were asked to list their observations and also sort them. The Geckos were taken for field trip to a public space to enable them to explore more about and identify the characteristics of a public space. They were then divided into groups and encouraged to share their understanding about the public space they visited.

Transdisciplinary Language:- In the descriptive writing exercise, the students wrote about public places of their choice. They were also introduced to the concept of pronoun and informed about when and how to use it. To reinforce the concept they were encouraged to read stories and identify pronouns they come across. The students probably enjoyed working on the picture composition, again on the theme of public spaces. We also had a guest talk on "Character", through which they came to know the difference between character and characteristics. Again to reinforce the concept they were asked to write the characteristics of different objects they see around and later write about the characteristics of their favourite character. Furthermore, to improve their vocabulary students were encouraged to find synonyms for the new words that came up in the inquiry. These included public, features, virtual, place and space among others. Finally they were also given comprehension exercises on the theme of physical and virtual public spaces.

Transdisciplinary Math:- Students were encouraged to connect the concept of place value when they discussed about the difference between a place and space. They further moved on to do practice on expansion form. They were also introduced to expanded notations. In the discussion on public space, students came up with the concept of "Money" and its role. This month also saw a continuation of the learning experience with the concept of time. They practiced sums related to time intervals, duration of time through word problems. At the same time, they also practiced word problems which highlighted the concept of division.

Hindi: The geckos started the month by learning मात्रा शब्द by learning matra words. They learnt the sounds of the letters. Students can change the given word and they can make new words. They have learnt संयुक्त व्यंजन जैसे क +श = क्ष, त +र = त्र , श + र = श्र , they can read and write sanyukt vyanjan letters and make words with that particular letter. They have understood the letters and words. They have learnt to write simple sentences by joining words. They have done worksheets on संयुक्त व्यंजन , and सरल वाक्य ।

Telugu: In the month of February the geckos have learned new vocabulary through the lessons "Paramanandaiah sisyulu and Nayana puli". They were also taught about ottu words, idioms and sentence formation.

French: The geckos started the month by learning the names of countries. They understood that each country has its own gender in French. As an extended part of their learning, the students have learnt the nationalities in masculine, feminine and plural forms. Now they can confidently tell their nationality in a simple sentence.

Dance: This month, the geckos have performed a variety of dance forms. Videos were shown to them to understand the steps of freestyle. Along with that we have discussed the importance of dance. We have also completed the clapping dance activity. This activity is useful for developing interaction skills among students. As part of the activity, students discussed about Dandiya, freestyle, Bhangra and created the steps.

Drama:- The geckos have worked on the following areas in the month of February:

- Explored the physical skills and challenges.
- The class's body as a collective. An ensemble.

Music:-The geckos continued exploring the element of music-"Harmony". They practiced adding up the simple harmonization for the songs they have learnt by using different scales within a single composition.

Art: The geckos continued learning ancient Roman art , Japanese folk art and started learning contemporary art.

PE: The geckos are learning athletics / running and starting positions like crouch start and its types like bunch or bullet start, medium start, elongated start. They also learnt the following:

- Finishing the run through finish, chest finish and shoulder finish.
- Relay races in starting and finishing positions.

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 Throwing and catching like under arm throw, upper arm throw, overhead throw with a fluff ball.



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
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

Month Ahead

Unit of Inquiry: In the month ahead the geckos will inquire into the purpose and uses of public space. They will discuss the dos and don'ts of actions in the public space as well as the responsibility of all to keep it safe. They will discuss and do research in the ICT lab related to the same.

The next inquiry will be on building materials. The students will focus on how useful materials can pose challenges to society and the environment. In this context, they will examine the nature of materials and the changes that happen to them along the way. This inquiry will be linked to climate change as well as with the ethical dimensions involved in the manufacturing and use of these materials.

Transdisciplinary Math: Here the geckos will produce the concept of area and will also be introduced to the concept of fraction. The number line will be used to plot fractions. It is assumed that this will give them a better understanding of the concept as well as placement of fractions. In the process, they will also be exposed to the use of fractions in everyday situations. Finally, they will continue to practice the use of mental and written strategies for addition and subtraction of two-digit numbers or beyond in real life situations.

Transdisciplinary Language:The geckos will be introduced to poster making and its elements. They will also be exposed to write formal letters in different contexts to public authorities. They will learn to organize ideas in a logical sequence, for example, write a simple narrative with a beginning, middle and end. Alongside, they will also be introduced to the concepts of prepositions and adverbs. Besides this they will continue using dictionary and the word bank to expand their vocabulary. Continuing as before, they will also be learning engagements involving read aloud, role play and dialogue delivery emphasizing on the right diction and punctuation.



Month Ahead

Hindi: Next month the geckos will learn small paragraphs on topics like Gandhi, and they will practice grammar part like [संज्ञा, क्रिया,].

Telugu: They will be learning the poems of Srikrishna Sathakam.

French: They will be learning a few general questions and answers. They will also learn different seasons of the year and a few expressions relating to weather conditions.

Dance:- Next month we are introducing a new western dance form and a dance activity.

Music: The geckos will learn a motivational song called 'Aap agar saath hai'. Discussion on the meaning of lyrics will take place and the form and texture of the song will be emphasized. Through this song they will also be introduced to a new rhythm pattern improvisation.

Drama: The geckos will be working on the following areas in the month of March:

- Value of imaginary creation.
- Work independently with self-confidence.
- Exploring the physical skills and challenges.

Art: Next month they will have assessments on "Art from different cultures, places and time."

PE: Next month the geckos will learn about:

- Basketball passing (chest pass, bounce pass, overhead pass)
- Football receiving (feet, thigh and head receive).
