March 2020- Monthly Review

All children have a right to survive, thrive and fulfill their potential – to the benefit of a better world.

Children worldwide face challenges, risks and opportunities. They react and respond to it. There are organizations that work to protect children from several risks and helps them to face challenges and opportunities in their day to day lives.

Unit of Inquiry:

In the previous unit 'Images' under the theme 'How we express ourselves' and in connect with the second lines of inquiry, geckos continued their learning on different types of design elements. In the assessment, the geckos created an image and identified the different elements of design. They also learned how to interpret and respond to images. The geckos were assessed during the summative assessment and were given scenarios to create an image using their own interpretation and imagination. The geckos developed (creative thinking thinking skills skills) and self management skills (organization skills).

The students were introduced to their current unit "Children Worldwide" under the theme 'Sharing the planet' by showing different pictures of children. They came up with the word child and shared the meaning of it. The geckos were shown a video of the story 'Hansel and Gretel' and they came up with the work- Challenges, Risks and Opportunities. They searched the meaning of it and listed down the challenges, risks and opportunities they face in their daily routine and school life.



Transdisciplinary Language: In connection with the unit 'Images', the geckos were introduced to prepositions (indicates the direction of an object) in the third line of inquiry– Way we interpret and respond to images. They were also introduced to Imagery. The geckos understood that Imagery can be used by descriptive writing that appeals to senses. The geckos interpreted poems through drawing and imagination in Imagery.

The geckos commenced to the new inquiry 'Children worldwide'. In connect with the new inquiry; the geckos were introduced to singular and plural. They continued learning about Character sketch (describing a person's personality, behaviour). They read a story and chose a favourite character of their own and made a character sketch of it.

Transdisciplinary Math: The geckos were introduced to types of lines under which they learned about the properties of perpendicular and parallel lines. They found the meaning of angles and looked at the different types of angles (right, obtuse, acute and straight angles). They were introduced to 2D(square, rectangle, triangle, hexagon, and pentagon) and 3D shapes(sphere, cylinder, and cube) under which they learned about the properties of these shapes. In addition to this, the geckos continued doing mental math and the number operations and word problems based on it.



March 2020- Monthly Review

2nd Language:

Hindi:

During this month, the geckos were introduced to 'r' ke roop (forms of 'r'). They understood the various types of 'r'- where they are used? How are they used? How are they pronounced? How are they different from each-other? Etc.

The geckos read the chapter, "satya ka path" where they tried to retell the story using their own words. To enhance their vocabulary, they recognized unknown words, and understood it's meaning. The geckos identified the forms of 'r' from the lesson and wrote them down in their notebooks.

The geckos also listened to the story 'the mouse and the lion'. They were asked questions related to the chapter- which were answered in their notebooks. This further helped them improve their sentence structure which is of vital importance in a language. They practiced the 'matras', spelling, etc. as they wrote the summary of the story in their notebooks.

Telugu:

Geckos of Grade 3 started the month of March by revising acchulu, hallulu, mahaprana aksharalu, singular and plural forms. They understood the story of Mahatma Gandhi and the story of Sravana Kumar through the lesson Mahatmudu.

French:

The geckos of Grade 3 started the month of March by learning prepositions of place. Geckos did a kinesthetic activity on the same where some of them took certain positions based on the teacher's instructions and the rest had to describe the positions that they had taken which required them to use the prepositions they had learnt.

Music: The geckos learnt a motivational song called 'Aap agar saath hai'. They discussed on the meaning of lyrics and the form and texture of the song. Through this song, they were introduced to a new rhythm pattern improvisation.

Dance: (Warm up) Bhangra dance – The students were divided groups and they improvised into and choreographed the bhangra movements and learnt different formations, structure, in bhangra. We demonstrated sequence, directions, and skilled the geckos to do choreography.

Drama: The geckos worked on the following areas in the month of March.

•Exploring the physical skills and challenges: awareness, control, expression, trust, imagination.

•Value imaginary creation.

•Behavior with objects concept.

Art and craft: The geckos worked on their own imaginative drawing with Acrylic paint on canvas.

The online classes started for the geckos of PYP from the start of April and is a grand success. The positive response and approach to make this online learning a success is greatly appreciated by the entire PYP team. Since the start of these classes, our students have been punctual and attentive as well as very participative and adaptive to this new learning platform. With the enthusiasm of our geckos and teachers, the online classes which started from early April continued till Thursday, 30th April, 2020.

Not only has the Gaudium education team converted the present adversity into an online educational opportunity but also enabled its students to embark on a fun-filled journey of accumulating knowledge from the very comfort of their homes.

Unit of Inquiry: The geckos continued with the theme "Sharing the planet".

After the initial introduction of the meaning of risks, challenges and opportunities the students further inquired into the risks and challenges faced by children across the world along side the available opportunities. The geckos were given the golden opportunity to self-assess themselves by creating their own success criteria using either rubrics, anecdotal records or checklists. Throughout the unit they developed critical thinking skills and self-management skills. This inquiry has enabled the students to think like global citizens and empathize with other children across the world.

The students during their current unit "Children Worldwide" inquired into the child rights enlisted across the world by UNCRC (United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child). They also researched about individuals and the humanitarian organisations that work to ensure child rights protection.



Transdisciplinary Language:

A transdisciplinary connection to writing character traits was made after studying the biography of the child rights activist Malala Yousufzai. Furthermore, the students inquired into Epic stories and studied the characters in them.

In the second line of inquiry– *Ways children respond to challenges, risks and opportunities,* the geckos were introduced to making predictions about different scenarios. They investigated the scenarios and guessed if it was risk, opportunity or challenge. They also reflected upon the appropriate ways to react or respond to each predicted situation.

Going further, they revisited the concepts of the elements of story, prepositions, conjunctions, adjectives, question words, antonyms and synonyms. The geckos collaborated using online resources like Padlet and Google docs to share their reflections on several educational movies, Ted Talks and audible books.



Transdisciplinary Math:

The geckos made a connection to graphs based on the data collected on specific challenges. They also made a connection to word problems while observing the challenges they faced in their daily lives.

The geckos were introduced to number patterns and practiced the same. They solved several sums on number and geometric patterns. Moreover, they revisited the concepts like time and inverse number.

2nd Language:

Hindi:

During this month, the geckos were introduced to 'ling' (gender). Gender plays an important role in language development. It helps specify the role of characters and further develops thinking skills. The geckos completed a worksheet based on the same topic. Learners also revised 'muhavre'(idioms) and paryaywachi(synonyms) through unseen passages. The students shared their views and ideas on 'sangya' (noun), sarvanam (pronoun) and visheshan (adjectives), they revised the above topics which were learned in the previous classes. The geckos also revised the numbers in Hindi.



Telegu: The geckos learnt to make different words from given words by removing the first letter. They also learnt to find the answers with the help of given information and learnt tenses.

French: The geckos were taught how to conjugate the "ger" group of verbs and how to frame sentences employing those verbs. They have also revised the "er" group of verbs.

Music:

Geckos practiced the vocal exercise of classical musical notes. They understood the importance of pitch and dynamics through this exercise. They also explored on different kinds of musical instruments and discussed which category those instruments belong to. The geckos also got introduced to a new song namely "I'm ready to go".

Dance:

Zumba dance - children learnt Zumba steps is a lower body workout that incorporates Zumba routines and step aerobics with Latin dance rhythms.



Drama:

The geckos worked on the following areas for the month of April.

•Basic etiquettes of a digital performer and an audience.

•Techniques of controlling the expressions and exercising its intensity accordingly.

•Building a strong relationship between an actor and an audience.

•Watching the performance videos from across the world as a reference to gain knowledge of the different styles of performance.

Art and craft:


The geckos worked on their own imaginative drawing with Acrylic paint on canvas. They organized time effectively on a given assessment task.


PE (Physical Education) -







