Unit of Inquiry:

The geckos have inquired into the ways humans interact with the environment where they made connections to pollution, deforestation, hunting and poaching. They went on a field trip to the Godrej Green business centre and inquired the ways to reduce the negative impact of human interactions. The geckos were also enlightened about the biodiversity of the area and measures the organization has taken to protect it. Through ICT the students also inquired into the consequences of the factors and made connections with global warming, extinct and endangered species. They completed the unit with the Assessment using the Design thinking process.

Transdisciplinary Language:

The geckos made connections to picture compositions, haiku poems, newspaper reports and persuasive writings. They read unit related articles and reading comprehensions. They continued to write creative stories and reading the novel Matilda.

Transdisciplinary Math:

The geckos continued performing addition and subtraction of decimals. They were introduced to multiplication of decimals with whole numbers and multiplication of decimals with decimals. They also solved word problems involving the four operations of decimals.

2nd Language:

Hindi:

The geckos were introduced to the concept of "विदेशी कहानियाँ" which is Foreign stories under types of story. keeping in mind that Visual language-viewing and presenting allow students to understand the ways in which images and language interact to convey ideas, values and believes. Geckos had watched, the series of foreign stories like 'Sindbaad the sailor' and 'Veer Hercules' in Hindi. Later they discussed about the character and plot and reflected on their learning. Geckos read a poem "कर लो पर्यावरण सुधार" and understood the depth of author's intention and the message he wants to give through the poem. They were asked to choose their own style to present their understanding and learning, in which they designed posters using shapes, colours, symbols, writing slogans to save environment. Some of them researched and collected poems on environment and recited in the class. Few wrote a paragraph to reflect on their learning and one gecko wrote a letter to his community to plant more trees in the society to save environment. All these learning engagements helped geckos to enhance their presentation skills and vocabulary.

French:

The geckos learned the rules of negation and interrogation. Geckos can now transform simple sentences into negative and interrogative forms.

Telugu - The geckos learnt "chandassu" in telugu. They learnt the ways to find guru laguvulu in poems. They also learnt Telugu vibhaktu and to write sentences with quotations. The geckos also learnt Sumathi sathaka poems.

Dance:

(Warm up and the clapping dance activity)

The children learnt rasa and navarasas in Bharatanatyam and second set of adavus (Natta adavu). They also practiced Western dance: in preparation for Grade 5 graduation day.

Music: The geckos learnt the song 'Earth anthem'. They sang this song in different languages, as this is a multi language song. This happened to be a new learning experience with respect to melody, rhythm and dynamics. The song brought a sense of awareness towards well being of our planet.

Drama: The geckos worked on the following areas:

- An indulgent stress on sense perception: looking, seeing, taste, smelling, touches.
- •The Mind: focus/ concentration/belief/ imagination/curiosity.

Art:

The geckos watched a video on Visual Art History. They have continued with their Cubism, Pop art and modern artwork. They experimented and experienced modern art style, to comprehend the changes in art around the world. They have worked on an assessment and understood the learning by writing their reflections. They displayed various attributes and skills during the creative art process.

PE: The geckos practiced the defense by playing the matches and one on one matches. They practiced the full court and half court drill to improve the ball handling skills and shooting.







PYP Online Classroom update

Unit of Inquiry:

The geckos were introduced to the new unit of inquiry where they explored the concepts of needs, wants, goods, services, consumers, producers, distributers and made connection to economy. They also inquired and researched about demand & supply, their graphical representation in the form of curves and the factors that affect the curves. The geckos made connections with consumer rights and responsibilities and enjoyed the learning engagements on identification of the consumer rights. During the unit, students watched videos, read articles, and attempted the quiz posted on Google classroom.

Transdisciplinary Language:

The geckos were introduced to the concept of direct and indirect speech and dialogue writing as they made connections with the unit of inquiry. They also practiced reading and poem comprehensions. Geckos also revisited a few critical concepts such as tense, punctuation, story writing, and haiku. They watched videos, practiced few sentences in their virtual classes and attempted doing the tasks posted on google classroom.

Transdisciplinary Math:

During the month, geckos made connections to percentage and profit and loss with their unit of inquiry on economy and practiced the sums virtually as well as on Google classroom. They solved tasks involving percentage, money and profit and loss together. They also revisited the concepts of decimals, fractions, basic 3-digit and 4-digit multiplications, all four-operations word problems, and BODMAS posted on Google classroom as Google forms.

2nd Language:

Hindi:

The geckos revised all the grammar parts like nouns, pronouns, adjectives, verbs, punctuation marks taught the previously to the students. Reading sheets, worksheets and links related to the topic so that they could understand the lesson better were shared with students. In order to develop creative writing in the students, the activity of writing picture descriptions in story, paragraph, and simple sentences was also given. The students practiced reading through reading sheets and online story links.

Telugu:


The geckos revised different types of stories, Sumati sataka poems and they did some worksheets of guru laghuvulu related with "chandassu". They revised telugu nakshatralu and raasulu, and completed worksheets related to telugu vibhakutulu.

French:

The geckos primarily revised the verbs, adjectives and parts of speech which they have learnt in the past months. Geckos have been introduced to short comprehension passages and they have also learnt word cognates and how to translate a sentence using cognates.








