Values + Problem-Solving = Modern Mathematics



Today's generation confronts unfamiliar or unpredictable situations more frequently than people in the past. Presenting a problem and developing the skills needed to solve that problem is more motivational than teaching the skills without a context. It allows the students to see a reason behind learning Mathematics, and thereby become deeply involved in learning it. Mathematics has been encompassing skills and functions that would assist them to have smooth understanding regarding:

- · reading a map to find directions
- understanding weather reports
- understanding economic indicators
- understanding loan repayments

Teaching through problem-solving can enhance logical reasoning, help people to develop their own rules in a situation where an existing rule cannot be directly applied.

Fermi problems, named after the Mathematician who made them popular, is a type of problem which encourages pupils to be resourceful since these are problems which do not give enough information. Fermi problems initiates a need to source additional information to solve it.

The solution of these problems relies totally on knowledge and experience which the students have acquired. These skills are essential to building the resilience required for success in the problem-solving elements of complex Mathematics problems.

Virtual University Fair by College Board

Career counselling is imperative as it helps identify the real potential in a student and help to aim for the career which is the most suitable for a student. In the process of career development, a good higher education in an esteemed university is noteworthy, and so is being prepared and ready for it. Often, students are confused and ill-equipped for the various processes and preparations they are required to do for it. Here, at The Gaudium, no stones are left unturned to make sure the Geckos are well-equipped for the future. To bring such opportunities for our geckos a webinar was organized where the geckos had the unique opportunity to interact and clarify their doubts directly with the representatives from acclaimed global universities.

The career webinar session was organized by College Board on 7th and 8th August 2020 which gave the students and parents the opportunity to directly interact with Admissions Leaders from some of the top universities in the world like MIT, Columbia University, University of Cambridge, Purdue University, Hong Kong University, Yale NUS University, McGill University and University of Melbourne. College Board is a not-for-profit organization that helps students connect to colleges and in the process expand their access to higher education, thus increasing opportunities for the students to succeed in making the right choice. The webinar session commenced with an introduction on the College Board and thereafter introducing the members present in the webinar. A preface was shared with the participants on how the organization works and how it helps the students. From not only connecting students to the colleges, but they also offer various programs and services to help make the students university ready including programs such as SAT and Advance Placement Program. They updated that the College Board is the agency through which students can register for the PSAT, SAT and AP. 35 leading Indian universities now also accept SAT scores from Indian students when it comes to admission. Each university representative introduced themselves in the webinar and spoke about their work experience. They gave valuable information on the programs which are offered in their respective university, the entry requirements and also a brief description of the application process. Each of the universities proclaimed that they are offering a 'Hybrid' model for the 2020 applicants which implies that education would be online. They also notified that the application requirements would remain the same in the coming year as well. Few universities informed about the entrance exams such as SAT or ACT are optional when it comes to admissions. However, they also specified that if the students are looking for scholarships then they do require SAT scores. Other key factors were also discussed which are crucial for reviewing applications in the coming year such as 'Letter of Recommendations' from the school and academic performance of the student.

The session was an enriching one for the high school Geckos and their parents as they received appropriate information on the various universities' admission criteria thus paving the way for them to plan ahead for their successful career.

Feedback and reflections are an important part of the learning process and can have a high impact on student learning when it is immediate, regular and relevant. In order to make use of the feedback as an opportunity for students to set learning goals and iterate on their demonstrated learning we at The Gaudium have set up con-connect with parents and students on a common platform in the last week with staggered timings and days. Having successfully completed two e-periodic tests and a significant amount of internals in all the subjects in the past 2 months, the teachers guided the parents and the students on one -toone basis on what they have learnt, what went well, what could be improved, what could be done differently next time, their areas of strengths as well as improvement. The teachers also informed about subjects and board specific websites to be referred to, the best strategies and techniques to be used in order to improve their performance. The apprehension of the parents for their wards writing the board exams in the wake of the digital classes were put to ease as they truly understood the process of work being carried on by the teachers. The parents highly acknowledged and appreciated this initiative as it helped them to understand the child's strengths and challenges and measures to overcome it. They are expecting more meets in the future in order to strengthen the academic front for the children. The pandemic has changed the teaching and assessment methodologies of teachers and this meeting helped the teachers as well to bring out and share the intricacies of their class observations with the parents. To conclude this meeting has led to a positive working relationship between the teacher and parent, which in turn indeed help in improving the student's overall performance.






Con-Connect - Class XII

Class X- Career Counselling Session






The school assembly is a gathering of all or part of a school for variety of purposes, such as special programs or communicating information on a daily or weekly basis.

On Aug 3rd., the students of Class X, CBSE organized the assembly based on theme of 'Responsibility and Self-help'.










Independence Day Celebration








Graduation Ceremony of the Class of 2020
