Teachers' Day Celebration physically at school on September 4th










World Literacy Day Celebrations on September 8th


Many people in the world are not educated and most of them are girls. The number of illiterate people is around 773 million!


Literacy is really important, it is necessary to be literate if you want to succeed in life.


Hindi Diwas Celebrations on September 14th

University Fair - India & Overseas

For many students, the main benefit of attending a university fair is the opportunity to get your questions answered in person, in an informal discussion with admissions staff. As well as filling in gaps in the information available online, this is also a great way to get a feel for the ethos of the institution, and tailored advice on what you need to do next. This could be useful in helping you decide which course to apply for or which country to study in, as well as giving you practical tips on how to put together a application. Admissions successful officers will share what they look for when assessing applications, what common mistakes to avoid, and how to go the extra mile to make yourself stand out. These sessions are likely to be particularly useful if you use the opportunity to ask any remaining questions you have.

A university fair was organized both India and Overseas on 31st and 1st September 2021 by our school Career Counselor Ms. Mahitha Sammeta for Grade IX - XII students and parents. with The session started the introduction of the universities' representatives which was followed by detailed explanations of the programs which are offered by each university, scholarship opportunities provided and the description of the region where the universities are located at.
