International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IBDP) is a global curriculum pursued by students across the world. It aims at holistic development of the students where the students are engaged in developing the IB learner profile attributes. The ATL skills like communication, social, self management, thinking and research skills are fostered during the two years program. The students are provided with ample opportunities to acquire these skills through subject specific activities, student led events and various programs initiated in the school which helps them in making a mark in their future life. The IBDP is a perfect choice for students aiming at an academic course blended with research.

The cycle of examinations conducted in the two years tests the in depth knowledge of the student in the chosen subjects along with the Internal assessments and research project. The core components of the program which includes Extended Essav, Theory of knowledge and Creativity Activity and Service (CAS) forms the heart of the IB program. The students learn to carry out independent research and reflect on the nature of knowledge. The rigorous IB program is counterbalanced by CAS where the students get an opportunity to give back to the local community through service with creativity and activity. The course lays a foundation to the students aspiring to pursue under graduation at renowned universities in India and abroad.



The students having undergone the rigorous program for two years match the university requirements with ease with the timely guidance provided by the career counseling sessions.





As a part of their Internal Assessment, the learners are expected to speak on a visual prompt. The students were shown the below image as a prompt: They used the thinking routine of "claim, support and question". This routine encourages the process of reasoning by asking students to form interpretations and to support them with evidence. Questioning interpretations can help students see reasoning as an ongoing process. Make a **claim** (explanation, interpretation) about the topic, Identify **support** (things you see, feel, know) for your claim, Ask a **question** related to your claim. What isn't explained? This routine helped students take notice of claims presented and thoughtfully examine them. They developed their thinking skills. The students worked on a padlet to come up with their own claims, this was followed by a classroom discussion.

ATL skills provide a solid foundation for learning independently and with others. These skills help students prepare for, and demonstrate learning through, meaningful assessment. They provide a common language that students and teachers can use to reflect on and articulate on the process of learning.

On July 29th, Students presented their choice of text and analyzed the purpose , audience, tone and mood of the text in 3mins.

Satya Sri came up with a song on Coffee, Rohan with an advertisement on hats, Vishnu -an extract from his reading book. Each one had their choice of extract and tried to identify the elements of analysis. In the process the other students also contributed their perceptions of the text, which led to collaboration.

This activity helped them explore for a text and to express their thoughts in relevance to the context given. Communication was the key skill focused on and to manage their time was secondary. Though they have exceeded the time limit, they have met the objective in closely reading their chosen texts.





Holistic Excellence ATL Skills in History- Coherent Critical Analysis






The **Three-Way conference** ensured that students receive a safe platform to improve their academic performance by discussing the SWOT analysis of each child with the parents.




Core Values – World Gratitude and International Peace Day

Stakeholder Engagement-Teachers' Day






Stakeholder Engagement-Hindi Diwas








On the whole, the session was very interactive, and parents seemed happy and contented with the school's preparedness in conducting offline classes.



Stakeholder Engagement Career Counselling -Global University Fair



Mindfulness and Wellbeing





Global Leadership-TOK Exhibition








Global Leadership-IIHM Awards




Global Leadership Fun with English Language
