Freedom of expression –DE-STIJL



Later subject enrichment activity was done using Augmented Reality technology where students individually named the bones and shared the importance of them. 









Gaudium classes vibrated with the enthusiastic cheer of students who were thrilled to participate in class activities. They explored concepts through activities such as model making, origami, chart making.









Review meeting of pre board results with the Principal. Performance of students was reviewed and steps for the future were discussed.










International Day for elderly

Mahatma Gandhi

Pahatma Gandhi was the leader of a non-violent group revolting against British rule in India. He served as a lawyer, politician, activist and is considered as an Indian hero.

Mahatma Gandhi was born into a Gujarati family on October 2, 1869, in Porbandar. His real name was Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi. He was married to Kasturba when he was 13, and together they had five children. His family stayed in India while Gandhi went to London in 1888 to study law and South Africa in 1893.

His most famous contribution to India was the Salt Satyagraha Dandi March or the Dandi Satyagraha. This was an act of civil disobedience led by Gandhi to protest British rule in India. This march resulted in the arrest of 60000 people including Mahatma Gandhi. Finally, India got its independence on 15th August, 1947.

After his efforts to free India from British rule, he resorted to fasts and visited troubled areas.

Mahatma Gandhi was assassinated on the fateful day of 30, January 1948.

equm Hazrat Mahal:- Begum Hazrat Mahal was the wife of Wajid Ali Shah, the Nawab of Avadh who was banished to Bengal by the British. Post her husband's banishment, Begum took charge of Avadh as the regent and played a prominent role in the 1857 revolt. Like Rani Lakshmi Bai, she challenged British rule and especially opposed their mechanism of destroying the religious places.She is also known for leading a rebel force to capture Lucknow where she ruled for 10 months and confined the British rulers in the Lucknow Residency. This event is recorded in

History as the Siege of Lucknow. However, later the British rulers defeated the rebel force and Begum went into political asylum in Nepal and died in Kathmandu on April 7, 1879. She is said to have given the longest resistance to British rule.

Mahatma Gandhi:- Mahatma Gandhi is called Mahatma because of all of his great works and greatness all through his life. He was a great freedom fighter and non-violent activist who always followed non-violence all through his life while leading India for the independence from British rule. He was born on 2nd of October in 1869 at porbandar in Gujarat, India. He was just 18 years old while

studying law in England. Later he went to British colony of South Africa to practice his law where he got differentiated from the light skin people because of being a dark skin person. That's why he decided to become a political activist in order to do some political changes in such unfair laws. Later, He returned to India and started a powerful and non-violent movement to make India one independent country. He is the one who led the Salt March (Namak Satyagrah or Dandi March) in 1930. He inspired lots of Indians to work against British rule for their own independence.

And for a while, he was also the supporter of the Gandhian phi-


losophy but there were the 2 incidents which shifted his heart away from Mahatma Gandhi.

Feam CBSE conducted an online session titled "Understanding and managing child's behaviour" to discuss the role of parents into the physical and cognitive development of children.


Parents were given different tips on how to actively participate in the overall development of their children.

Online PTM was organised for parents who couldn't come to the campus physically.










Finally!




STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

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
