#### Assault on quality of education during the pandemic period

It is befitting to read the UNICEF working paper titled "Defining Quality in Education" at this point in time when education throughout the country has moved to online mode. It leads us to introspect the quality of education during this pandemic period. The country saw a nation-wide lockdown in the month of March last year. While economic activities

resumed slowly a few months after lockdown, schools are the last to open. Now, most of the states in our country have allowed schools to reopen, albeit for higher grades. The lower grades still continue with online education. Closure of schools and eventual switch to online classes across the country have caused immense damage to the quality of learning and teaching. Online classes are based on information and communication technology (ICT) like smartphones, tablets, computers, laptops, TV and radio. A whole range of 'digital infrastructure' such as uninterrupted & speedy internet connection, availability of 3G/4G signal and continuous power supply is necessary to use these devices to attend online classes. However, there are differences in the quality of digital infrastructure which cause differences in the quality of learning. While urban areas tend to have better digital infrastructure, the rural areas lag behind in this area. This is evident in the 75th round of National Sample Survey(NSS) report on Household Social Consumption on Education in India (2017-18) which says that only 15% of rural households had internet access during 2017-18, while the proportion of urban households having internet access was 42%.



An effective instructional method should inclusive and cater to the needs of students with different learning capacities. Beyond a point, online classes fail to be inclusive as these classes find it hard to meet the learning needs of students with learning disabilities. While most of the private schools are under tremendous pressure from parents to maintain student-centred teaching even in online classes, the online teaching in the case of government and government-aided schools, tend to be teacher-centred. This is primarily because of the limited scope for conductina various group activities, discussions and debate which are usually conducted in a typical physical classroom. These factors cause students from disadvantaged backgrounds to lag behind in their learning in online classes.

#### Holistic Excellence-TOK Debate










IBDP students need to write an essay based on one of the IB released knowledge questions in ToK (Theory of Knowledge). This year too the titles were released and after an initial whole class discussion which went on for 2 weeks, the IBDP year 2 students selected their titles of choice upon which they will write a 1600 word essay. To prepare them for the argumentative essay which comprises of real life situations that need to be explored from different perspectives, a debate was planned where the ToK Essay titles were the motions of the debate. The style of debating was the turncoat style of debating where the students presented contrary real life situations pertaining to the motions and explained knowledge issues lurking behind them. The debating sessions that went on for two weeks helped the students to see the loopholes in their planning of the essay.




The IBDP students at The Gaudium gave their first Semester examination from 15th November to 2nd December 2021.






# Stakeholder Engagement-International Day for Elderly



#### Global Leadership-All Hands Meet













I realised from our collective experience about the range of differing knowledge each of my group members possessed and how difficult it was to collaborate effectively online.
