

















MORALITY & INTEGRITY ASSEMBLY REFLECTION

Do not be too moral. You may cheat yourself out of much life so. Aim above morality. Be not simply good, be good for something. - Henry David Thoreau

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






Buzz Wire Game


Buzz wire is a steady hand game that is well known to many as a table top amusement. Buzz wire is a challenging and competitive game where you are playing the number of touches against time. The player has to get the right balance between speed and skill in order to complete successfully..

The object of the game is to carefully move the wire wand loop along the copper wire "maze" without touching it. When the loop touches the wire, you will hear a "BUZZ". The goal is to be fast and at the same time to be efficient, having the least amount of touches.

Grade 10 Learners have designed a challenging and competitive game for the visitors during the farmers market. Learners have applied their scientific knowledge and circuit design skills which they have been studying in physics to make their idea possible. Students have used conductive materials like copper wire, electrical wire, switch, buzzer and battery and connected them in a series to complete the circuit. The circuit makes a buzz sound when the loop touches the wire because the circuit gets closed.

The students have explored various conductive materials and insulators while identifying the materials for the project and experienced the circuits of series and parallel connections and results of it.


