ATL skills-Critical thinking in Computer Science

The IBDP not only focuses on what concepts we are delivering to the learners, but the actual beauty of the curriculum lies in how the concepts are delivered efficiently to the learners. IB standards and practices focus in classroom teaching in various ways through IB learner profile and attitude, formative assessments, summative assessment, inquiry based learning, international mindedness, and various ATL skills. Also the teaching is very interesting and challenging in IBDP as we have to integrate TOK,CAS and Extended Essay as well. At The Gaudium school, we are provided with every resource, platform and support to execute this curriculum successfully. In this article I will give one sample example of using one of the ATL skills in the Computer science subject.

One of the important skill in Computer Science is Critical thinking. It is part of the Approaches to teaching and learning – Thinking skill. Critical skill helps learner develop logical, computational and Mathematical skills as well. Students are given various real time problems in JAVA in which they were depicting the role of IB Profile "thinker" and were trying to solve problems using logic and proper syntax. These kind of activities also help them to deal with solving various errors that can occur during programming. This is the first level of confidence gathered through which they can take a decision of taking IA topic with complexity in programming. In this process students compare their logic with peers and check for the efficiency of the code. Hence critical thinking skill gives them the ability to think clearly and understand the connection between different ideas. It also gives them the opportunity to be a reflective and independent learner.

Incorporating Graphic Display Calculators (GDC) in Mathematics classrooms enables educators to craft powerful collaborative learning experiences that support problem solving and flexible thinking.IBDP Students who are expected to always have access to a graphic display calculator during the course and in exams were given hands on practice with varied GDC options. Students were given instructions on GDC settings, various modes that they can switch during the exam pertaining to the needs of topics assessed. My topic of research is effect of temperature on the calcium content of milk. After I finalized my topic I read a couple of journals, research papers, and university websites to figure out the method for the research. I found multiple, but I decided on doing it using complexometric titration because it was possible to do it in the school laboratory and the materials required could easily be obtained. After I finalized the method, I assumed that conducting the experiment and recording values would be simple. However, I was wrong because I had to repeat the experiment almost 8 times by tweaking the method with the help of teacher, to suit my needs of research. I spent almost a whole week in the lab but I thoroughly enjoyed it because the final outcome of the experiment working was worth it. Getting to do my own research by using all the equipment and not relying on a teacher to show me how to do things was quite exhilarating. I learned about what it would be like to work in an actual lab and gained thinking,research and self management skills and working independently with patience and persistence. Without patience, it would have been extremely difficult to survive in the lab because of the number of failed attempts it takes to finally get the experiment to work. The research process would have been extremely difficult without help and guidance from our chemistry teacher and lab incharge.

#### Core Values-Assembly on Empathy-Emotional Quotient













#### Core Values-Assembly on Empathy-Emotional Quotient










# Mindfulness and Wellbeing-Role of hormone and changes in adolescence

#### The age of complex emotions and bodily changes: Adolescence

Puberty is that phase of development in an adolescence life where the child undergoes a growth spurt . An adolescent may grow several inches in several months followed by a period of very slow growth, then have another growth spurt. However when we think of puberty we generally think of only the physical changes but along with the physical changes the child's brain also develops and there grows a pool of mixed emotions which if not taken care of appropriately might lead to psychological stressors.

The session on "Role of hormones and changes in adolescence" was taken on 3rd of December for grade 9 to 12 across CI, CBSE and IBDP curriculum to make students aware about their physical and emotional changes during this period of transition to overcome the psychological stressors that can affect their social and academic spheres . Also this session aimed at understanding coping strategies to cope with unhealthy traits and temperament during puberty and how to take <u>care of the physical changes</u>.





The session gave an insight on acceptance of bodily changes during puberty like growth of facial hair, body odour, pimple and acne on enlargement of voice box face, and development of genitals in both the sexes. Students were asked to reflect on their changes and how they have reacted to their emotional and bodily changes. The session provided social skills and self -efficacy like performing light exercises, yoga, drinking adequately, reflecting on what elders and mentors instructs in the class/home before taking an abrupt decision . These skills will help the students identify their unhealthy temperaments during puberty and also help them to cope and accept their bodily changes in a positive way.


#### Global Leadership-Extended Essay Cafe Presentation
