The students learnt to identify, differentiate and understand the function of each building block from the kit. Students researched about various sense organs used in robotics to sense the physical changes.








Aboriginal art of the world

A boriginal art is art made by indigenous people. Aboriginal art is closely linked to religious ceremonies or rituals. It is an important part of the world's oldest continuous cultural tradition, based on totems and the Dreaming. There are several types of and methods used in making Aboriginal art, including rock painting, dot painting, rock engravings, bark painting, carvings, sculptures, and weaving and string art. Australian Indigenous art is the oldest ongoing tradition of art





in the world. The artists decided to eliminate the sacred elements and abstracted the designs into dots to conceal their sacred designs which they used in ceremony. Dots symbolise stars, sparks, burnt ground etc. as the base of an Aboriginal painting is the organisation of the earth and the ancestral connection with it.

Pointillism is a technique of painting in which small, distinct dots of colour are applied in patterns to form an image. Georges Seurat and Paul Signac developed the technique in 1886, branching from Impressionism.














Dear Prime Minister...




Exemplifying Empathy...


