Mindfulness and Well-being

Students practiced mindful breathing and mindful movement using bell breathing, squid and relax technique, flower pose and focus breathing. Programme of Inquiry and Curriculum Review

The team reviewed the POI (Programme of inquiry) and engaged in curriculum mapping for Language and Math as well as single subjects to highlight transdisciplinary connections with the units of inquiry.

Single subject teachers reviewed their respective curricula and finalized the annual plan.

The scope and sequence documents were also reviewed as well.

Review of school policies

The PYP team read through school policies and shared their individual reflections. They later worked in different groups to present their understanding of the policies.

They reviewed the school policies as a team.

Planning for the five developmental pillars -

The core team for 5 developmental pillars reviewed and reflected on the implementation of the activities planned for the academic year 2021-22. They started working on the planning for the next academic year.









Unit of Inquiry: Transdisciplinary Theme:

How the world works

Central Idea:

The design of buildings and their structures is dependent on a range of factors.

Lines of Inquiry:

- Factors to consider while building a structure.
- Indigenous architecture
- Ways buildings impacts the environment

Key Concepts:

connection, responsibility, function

IB Learner Profile:

Inquirers, Open-minded, Caring

Unit of Inquiry: Students continued to explore about indigenous architecture. They also inquired about ways buildings impact the environment and reflected on the consequences. In the concluding task, students were able to share plan of building, justifying their choices and explained how the designed building will serve the purpose. They demonstrated a strong conceptual understanding and made authentic connections with the central idea of the unit.

Transdisciplinary Language:

Students explored the structure of a sentence and a paragraph. They also looked into the stricture of an essay. They learnt that an essay can be written on different topics, and it has an introduction, body and conclusion in paragraphs. They also used conjunctions to frame meaningful sentences. Students understood the difference between fact and opinion as well.










Transdisciplinary Math: Students identified symmetrical and asymmetrical buildings and structures. They were able to connect with money as a factor and did basic conversions. They explored about the currencies of different countries and located the places on map where these currencies are used. They revisited concepts in Math and practiced problems using Mental math.

PE: Students learned Yoga-Floor asana 1-Bhujangasana 2-Uttanasana and discussed the benefits of theses asanas. They practiced the skills which they have learned during the physical education sessions. They performed running with variation- run on the spot, zig-zag run, shuttle run, jump with variation- vertical jump, standing broad jump, jump forward and backward, throwing with variation- overarm throw, underarm throw and overhead throw. They discussed the use and technique of the learnt skills.

Drama: Students had opportunity to express themselves using props. They learnt using different objects as props for enacting a character in a given situation. They worked on their expressions. They engaged in vocal exercises as well.

Dance: Students have learned different levels of moves like high-low, leap, sway, balance, dimension (big/small/narrow), action and reaction, and freeze. They also learnt about tempofast and slow, and rhythm(on beat and off beat) while engaging in dance.

Music: Students revisited musical elements like pitch, melody and rhythm. They also made connections between music and emotions and reflected that music has a steady beat. Students practiced the songs 'Up Down', 'I am the music man', '500 miles 'and 'Vande Mataram'.









Art: Students co-constructed the assessment task, criteria, and tool for the final assessment to reflect on their learning. They revisited the previously learnt concepts like elements of art and practiced the technique of paper folding to create their artwork.

Spanish: Students were introduced to the letters X, Y, Z. They were shown pictures, rhymes and songs related to the syllables of each letter. They learnt new words beginning with these letters and practiced the learnt syllables and new vocabulary in Spanish.

Hindi: Students were introduced ল, ব, যা, ম, ह, क্ष, স and বা through pictures, poems and stories related. They identified, pronounced, and practiced formation of the akshars ল, ব, যা, ম, ह, ধ্ৰ, স and বা. They also learnt making words using these letters. Students revisited all the letters covered so far.

Telugu: Students revisited Varnamala. They learnt numbers 1-20 in Telugu. Students also learnt the names of different colors and names of days of the week. They participated in oral recitation and made simple words using the letters learnt.




