Holistic Excellence- Group 4 Project Planning

GROUP-4 PROJECT

The group 4 project is an interdisciplinary activity in which all Diploma Programme science students must participate. The intention is that students from the different group- 4 subjects analyze a common topic or problem and work for approximately 10 hrs of involvement time. It aims at promoting Interdisciplinary Collaboration, Appreciation of the environmental, social, and ethical implications of science and technology, Development of teamwork, Development of planning skills, Exchange or sharing of both data collected and issues raised. The subjects involved in the project are Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Computer Science, and SEHS.

The group-4 project addresses aims 7, 8 and 10 of the group 4 subject guides and must be based on Science or its applications.

Aim 7: "develop and apply 21st-century communication skills in the study of science."

Aim 8: "become critically aware, as global citizens, of the ethical implications of using science and technology."

Aim 10: "develop an understanding of the relationships between scientific disciplines and their influence on other areas of knowledge"..

Each group may investigate the same topic or different topics—that is, there may be several group 4 projects in the same school. Students studying environmental systems and societies are not required to undertake the group 4 project. The project can be practically or theoretically based. Collaboration between schools in different regions is encouraged. Each team consists of 4-6 students, with a mixture of science disciplines represented. The multidisciplinary team study a particular science topic within the same theme. The 10 hours allocated to the group 4 project, which are part of the teaching time set aside for developing the practical scheme of work, can be divided into three stages:



- Planning,
- Action and
- Evaluation.

The planning stage must involve all group 4 students meeting to "brainstorm" and discuss the central topic, sharing ideas and information. In the action stage, there should be collaboration during the action stage; findings of investigations should be shared with other students within the mixed/single-subject group. Symposium where all the students, as individuals or as groups, give brief presentations (or) It can be in the form of a science fair where students circulate around displays summarizing the activities of each group.

The Group-4 project for the 2021-23 cohort will start after the summer vacation in the month of June. The students were introduced to the project at the beginning of the academic session in DP1. They have identified a few topics but were asked to brainstorm during the vacation where all subjects can be integrated and should have some societal impact. The final submission deadline is 22nd October 2022.

Holistic Excellence- Robotics Competition






recently participated in **FIRST Tech Challenge (FTC)** which is a robotics competition for students in grades 7–12 to compete head to head, by designing, building, and programming a robot to compete in an alliance format against other teams. FIRST Tech Challenge is the one of the four major robotics programs organized by **FIRST**

The competition consists of local and regional qualifiers and the world championship, and in every season, a kickoff is held to showcase the season's theme and game. After kickoff, robots are designed, built, and programmed by teams, and teams are encouraged to conduct outreach with their communities. Local qualifiers are held for teams to compete and qualify for regional qualifiers, and from that point, regional qualifiers are held for teams to qualify for the world championship.

The robot kit is Android-based, and it is programmed using Java, the Blocks programming interface, or other Android programming systems. Teams, with the guidance of coaches, mentors and volunteers, are required to develop strategy and build robots based on innovative, sound engineering principles. Awards are given for robot performance as well as for community outreach, design, and other real-world accomplishments.We have won international awards in the first lego league and aim to do the same in ftc

Core Values- Students Reflections, My gratitude for The Gaudium School


he graduation ceremony was the start to my journey through the next chapter of my life. This event made me reminisce and want to reflect upon my journey through IBDP at gaudium.






Stakeholder Engagement-Final Examination Orientation to Students and Teachers

Stakeholder Engagement-Teacher's Collaboration on Code of Conduct and Policies Documents







Global Leadership-TOK Mock Exhibition IBDP1

































Global Leadership-Graduation Day

DP VISUAL ARTS EXHIBITION

The IBDP visual arts exhibition is the culmination of the students' IB Art experience. Students present a selection of their best work in the form of a curated final show, and defend and articulate their purpose and intention in a written rationale. The selected pieces show the evidence of their technical accomplishment during the visual arts course and an understanding of the use of materials, ideas and practices appropriate to visual communication. At the final art exhibition titled 'GATEWAY' each higher-level student curated 10 works of art, aiming to demonstrate their technical skills, conceptual qualities, and a cohesive body of work. Both the student artists displayed a great range of media, from photography, drawing, and painting to installation. Each student communicated their intentions to provide an emotional or symbolic reasoning for each piece which allowed the viewers to form their own response. The exhibition was inaugurated by Mr. Ramakrishna Reddy the honorable CEO of The Gaudium school.

Talking about their reflections on their journey and achievements through the exhibition, one of the student Navya Viryala said through this exhibition, she wanted to make people recognize their uniqueness, but as she transitioned from the first year of the Diploma Programme to the second year, she realized that there were so many more dimensions to the individual than she had realized, making her exhibition what it is today."

Another student Nikita Nanduri said her exhibition was heavily influenced by her own experiences with Urbanization. The imagery was influenced by the architectural style of deconstruction, which is characterized by simpler forms in contrast to complex ones. She felt that it was very appropriate for the theme of her exhibition because she wanted to simplify climate change and the impact that urbanization has on it.



The viewers were enthralled with the conceptual qualities in the work of art which demonstrates how the imagery, signs and symbols have been successfully resolved to realize the function, meaning and purpose. Their works demonstrate the effective application and manipulation of media, materials, and formal qualities. Finally, their curatorial rationale justifies the selection, arrangement and exhibition of a group of artworks within a designated space, as appropriate to stated intentions.


