Professional Development

Programme of Inquiry and Curriculum Review

The team reviewed the POI (Programme of inquiry) and engaged in curriculum mapping for Language and Math as well as single subjects to highlight transdisciplinary connections with the units of inquiry.

Single subject teachers reviewed their respective curricula and finalized the annual plan.

The scope and sequence documents were also reviewed as well.

Review of school policies

The PYP team read through school policies and shared their individual reflections. They later worked in different groups to present their understanding of the policies.

Planning for the five developmental pillars -

The core team for 5 developmental pillars reviewed and reflected on the implementation of the activities planned for the academic year 2021-22. They started working on the planning for the next academic year.

Learning and Teaching- Month Review

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Theme: All About Myself

Students were introduced to “Parts of the body” through flash card and rhymes. They engaged in hand and foot printing, task on identifying and pasting the body parts. They were also introduced to the concept of family through rhymes and flash cards.

Literacy: Students learnt new words and became acquainted with the words like In-out and Right-Left through action and rhymes. They enthusiastically participated in learning engagements like showing In – out through actions- throwing and catching the ball, putting the balls in and out of the basket, etc.

Music: Students practiced “Wheels on the bus” and “Where is thumbkin” rhyme. They enjoyed listening to the music played by the teacher and practiced the song/rhyme along with the facilitator following the tune of the song/rhyme with the keyboard.

Numeracy: Students were introduced to “Triangle” shape through rhymes related to triangle shape and objects. They also participated in learning engagements like making triangle shape using crayons and other real objects, using ice cream sticks, straws to make a triangle shape, etc.

Dance: Students learnt different body movements like jump, run, nod, hands movements as well as leg movements.

PE. : Students learned hand and leg exercises. They engaged in –Pick and place, color touch, walk for a distance, crossing obstacle stations. Students crossed different stations by walk. kicking and throwing the ball.

Arts: Students continued to explore clay modelling by making basic shapes. They continued to explore shapes by joining the dots and filling it with their choice of colour. They could also relate the shapes with the objects from their surroundings like circle and triangle.
