### **Global Leadership**


Students organized and conducted their weekly assemblies as part of the global leadership pillar.

Students were involved in making choices, co-constructing essential agreements, and assessment tasks.





Students were introduced to goal setting. They set their goals on any one aspect of well-being – physical, social, emotional and intellectual.









### Unit of Inquiry: Transdisciplinary Theme:

Who we are

### **Central Idea:**

Well being is a balance of interconnected factors.

### Lines of Inquiry:

• Understanding well-being.

### **Unit of Inquiry:**

Students started the inquiry on wellbeing under the trans disciplinary theme 'Who we are'. They had prior knowledge assessment where they engaged in various activities such as dance, outdoor exercise, mindfulness, circle time followed by a discussion. The meaning of well-being was co-constructed with the students.

While inquiring, students understood the meaning of well-being and the various factors that contribute to our well-being.

They inquired as to how various aspects of well-being are inter-connected. Students also discussed how our wellbeing is different from each other and how it is determined by who we are, our identity, our culture, etc.









#### **Transdisciplinary** Language:

Students continued with their weekly spelling assessments. They connected with the concept of homonyms after being introduced to the term well-being in their inquiry. They came up with examples of homonyms.

They were able to connect to nouns during the homeroom discussions and sorted the nouns according to name, place, animal or thing.

Students started reading the Oxford Reading Tree books. They engaged in reinforcement of cvc words and blends.

Students made transdisciplinary connections with compound words.

### **Transdisciplinary Math:**

Students continued working on mental Math every day to revisit the concepts learnt earlier.

They made connections with 'data collection, data presentation and data analysis' while inquiring about different aspects of well-being.

They made a human graph first based on the data collected in the classroom. They then looked at other ways data can be presented. They inquired further into pictograph and bar graphs. and after collecting data moved on to make a bar graph.

Students discussed the importance of data handling and connected with real life examples.









#### French:

In the month of July 2022, the learning students the are greetings, small the conversations of asking and responding to name, age, how it's vou and multiple are responses. They are learning the letters of the alphabets, and the days of the week in French.

#### Spanish:

In the month of July 2022, students learnt to read and write the spellings of the alphabets, numbers (0 to 20) articles, the fruits, months of the year, the body parts, family members, animals and greetings using different strategies such as pictures, flash cards and videos.

#### Hindi:

Students were introduced to 'ka' and 'kha' akshar. They heard a story based on these letters of the alphabet and later discussed the answers to their questions. They shared their views on the story which helped them increase their thinking skills. Learners explored how 'k' and 'kh' words are written- they did a learning engagement wherein, they matched these letters to the first sound of the image.

Students learned new words which they came across from the story. They recited the poem 'Ek Kawwa Pyaasa Tha' in class and identified the words related to the 'k' letter.

Students practiced counting numbers from 1 to 10-orally and written- through the medium of poem 'dhobi aaya'.







### Telugu:

This month students through a 'self introduction' task engaged in assessment of their oral language skills.

The consonants 'ka' and 'kha' are introduced by watching, singing and listening to children's plays and stories. Identifying and naming an object to support the development of skills in Telugu language.

#### Drama:

Students worked on the following area demonstrating the attribute of a thinker for the month of July – Storytelling.

They watching a children's theatre to find the elements of a performance and identified the elements of drama.

They also enacted a character of choice from the performance.

### Dance:

Students were introduced to the basic stretches and warm up exercise they where explored words like - jump, spin, hop, bounce from a recorded music. They listened to music and engaged hand leg and movements in accordingly. They further shared their understanding on how these movements were different. This enabled them to connect to the beat/ tempo/ speed of the music and also enhance their creative thinking skills.







#### PE:

Students participated in basic warm up exercises and engaged in fun tasks. They framed the essential agreements and engaged is a task to demonstrate different movements and they reflected on the same.

#### **Music:**

Students introduced themselves to each other and coconstructed the essential agreements. They revisited rhythm from the elements of music and enjoyed singing songs learned in the previous year.

#### Art:


observed different Students pictures/artworks and shared their prior knowledge about art. They introduced to different were colouring techniques such as lines, colours etc. Students were shown two different paintings and asked to categorize using primary and secondary colours. Students also engaged in creating their own art work using primary and secondary colours to express their feelings towards their friends. They further self-reflected on their learning.






























































































### **Transdisciplinary** Theme:

How we organize ourselves

#### **Central Idea:**

Signs and symbols are part of human made systems that facilitate local and global communication.

#### **Lines of Inquiry:**

- Signs and symbols.
- Ways visual language facilitates communication
- Specialized systems of communication

### Key Concepts:

Form, Perspective, Function

### **IB Learner Profile:**

Inquirers, Communicators, Knowledgeable, Caring

#### Unit of Inquiry:

The students will find out the meaning for the words signs and symbols. They will further inquire why we need signs and symbols in our life and where we can see and use different signs and symbols. They will further inquire how signs and symbols are similar and different.

They will also inquire about communication and how visual language facilitates communication.







#### **Transdisciplinary** Language:

Students will explore the usage of different signs and symbols in the language and how they help communicate with each US other. They will explore different ways we express ourselves using paragraph writing, descriptive writing etc. They will participate different learning in explore the engagements to rules we follow while expressing our ideas like usage of the words specific for use and punctuations.

### **Transdisciplinary Math:**

Students will explore the usage signs and symbols of in mathematics like greater than, less than and equal to etc. They will inquire about these symbols and their usage while comparing the numbers. They will connect with the symbols of different arithmetic operations and their meaning addition. like subtraction, multiplication and division.

#### Hindi:

In August students will be introduced to the letters of the alphabet-'Ga', 'Gh', 'anga'- from the 'ka varg'. They will read stories based on this concept and revise the letters taught in the class previously.

### French:

In the month of August 2022, students will learn about the months of the year, numbers from 1 to 20 and introduce themselves in French. They will interact and further develop language skills to facilitate communication in French.







#### Spanish :

In August students will learn articles, fruits, months of year, the body parts and family members. They will collaborate, express and reflect in Spanish.

#### Telugu:

Students will be introduced to the letters 'Ga', 'Gha', and practice Telugu numerals.

#### **Music:**

Students will be introduced to pitch, melody and tune.

They will practice vocal exercises and clap in time with a beat. Students will learn to sing a new song 'You are my sunshine'.


#### Art:

The students will continue their inquiry about primary and secondary colours. They will also inquire about cool and warm colours in the elements of art. They will observe different artwork, discuss the features and compare and contrast them. Students will work on their chosen artwork.

### PE:

Students will engage with different learning engagements based on athletics.

- Introduction of athletics
- Running techniques
- 60 -meter dash
- Variations of running









### Drama:

Students will work on the following areas demonstrating the attribute of a thinker/communicator during the month of August:

- Body language Watching the characters and identifying their body language.
- Exploring Eye contact, body movement, gesture, voice of character.

#### Dance:

Students will watch a video of a dance performance and share – what they see, think and wonder – costumes, hands, legs, and expressions. They will be given opportunity to reflect on their feelings through the music.
