Students shared real-life examples where they demonstrated respect.






Holistic Excellence:

IB Learner profile-

Principled, Thinkers, Reflective, Balanced **Monthly review**: The new academic year began on a cheerful note. Students were excited about physical schooling. During circle time students patiently listened to each other and took turns to share more about themselves, including their likes and dislikes, how they spent time during holidays as well as their expectations about the classes. The classes started with mindfulness practice which we hope will help them concentrate better. Later, students made the essential agreements for the class. During circle time, we also discussed ATL and core values.

Unit of Inquiry: Students started their inquiry under the transdisciplinary theme 'How we organize ourselves'. The students explored and inquired about various physical and virtual spaces. Thev understood the meaning of space and place. While inquiring they identified the difference between personal and public spaces and defined them by connecting with their daily life experiences. The students further inquired about the characteristics and purposes/uses of physical and virtual public spaces. They shared their responsibilities towards public and private spaces.









Transdisciplinary Math

Students made transdisciplinary connections to 'place value' and practiced the same through various learning engagements. They were introduced to shapes and also asked make real life to connections by identifying usage of the shapes around them. Students explored the characteristics and properties of the different shapes. They made transdisciplinary connection with the concept of measuring area. They explored how we can measure the area (space occupied by a shape).

Students continued doing mental math every day to revisit the concepts learned earlier.

Transdisciplinary Language

made transdisciplinary Students connections to 'nouns' and practiced the same through various learning engagements. Students identified and sorted the common nouns and proper nouns. On exploring further about physical and virtual spaces, students made connections to also homonyms, adjectives and synonyms and antonyms. Students can understand that homonyms are two or more words having the same pronunciation spelling or but different meanings. Students were Introduced to descriptive writing.

They continued to read the different stories to enhance their communication skills. They explored new vocabulary. Students continued revising their ORT words and spelling assessment words by reading, writing and framing sentences.







French:

In the month of July 2022, students learned the self-introduction, numbers up to 50, days of the week and months of the year in French.

Spanish:

In the month of July 2022, students learned the Alphabets (write and read) spelling, greetings, weekdays, cardinal numbers (0 to 20), greetings from a document, video, images presented.

Telugu

This month students were introduced to the class through а 'selfintroduction' task for assessment of their oral language skills. The vowels and consonants from Varnamala is revised and practiced. Students reviewed by making, reading and 'simple words' from the writing alphabet. They get introduction to 'dheergham' which is 'gunitam sign' through the story, practicing vocabulary. Practiced saying sentences and writing words using some alphabetic words. And the introduction of the 'gudi' symbol is practiced through an Ábhinaya Gayam (Bathukamma Adudam).

Hindi

Students enthusiastically shared their vacation time with their classmates. Students prior knowledge analysis was done in the class, under which some pictures were displayed to the students and they wrote the first letter of those pictures. Students practiced and revised multiple topics such as consonant letters, two letter words, three letter words and four letter words. They were able to recognize the letter of the alphabet and write it in their books with its accurate pronunciation. In the month of July, students were introduced to the aa&; matra, under which they learned to pronounce and write by applying the aa matra on the consonant letter. Learners saw some real-life related material like rice rajma, lentils, papad in the class. They enthusiastically learned the name of all the things by pronouncing it, and analysing the aa matra sound. Students read the poem related to the aa matra - Nana aaye ki yaad ki and new words of aa quantity written in your booklet.







Drama:

Students worked on the following areas demonstrating the attribute of a communicator for the month of July Finding the elements of a story in a creative approach. Sequencing in text – Understanding the importance of sequencing in any text.

Dance:

Students were introduced to the Basic stretches and warm up exercise where they explored words like – Jump, spin, Hop, Bounce for a recorded music .They listened to a piece of music and moved their hands and leas accordingly and further shared their understanding on how these movements were different .This enabled them to connect to the beat/ tempo/ speed of the music and also enhance their creative thinking skills.

Music:

Students, explored Hello song, which was designed for the music students to understand their peers and the teacher. Explored the instrument Tanpura (accompany instrument for vocal or instrumental performance)

Learn to sing swaras - Sa Pa Sa (constant notes or swaras in Indian music)

Explored three types of octaves (lower, medium, and higher)

Explored three types of Resonance (Throat, chestier and headier)

Done Vocal warm-up exercises to develop their vocalization, such as

1. Singing vowels (A, E, I, O, U)

2. Volume controller game

3. My name is....

Singing rhymes with the group

Practiced and explored group singing

Learned to identify the different pitches (scale) between Female, Male, and instrumental







Art:

Students observed pictures of 3 different art works of 3 different culture and shared, what they have noticed in the picture, Students later discusses - what is it? How are these similar and different? They identified the features of culture. Students have been asked to show any aspect of their real life using art style / form of different culture in any way that is (time unique to them bound engagement- time was decided by the students). They also shared their art work and the

Provocation assessment has been taken after the task. Students have shown 5 pictures of elements of art. (Lines, shape, colour etc.). They have discussed – what they see. They have note down and define these terms as well. Students will also draw these to show what they already know. Students drew a picture (real life happening) using the elements identified by them. They have shared and point out the elements used by them in their art work aspect of real life.

PE:

Students were introduced to PE, followed by warm-up exercises by watching the warmup video. Students were discussed and shared their Essential Agreements. Students were provoked to connect the central idea (Physical activities enhance spatial awareness) by performing on each station and reflect on each station. Station-1: Jogging, Station-2: Exercises, Station-3: Throw. Students were divided into different groups and shared their attributes of learner profile description and Students reflected on, how best do I learn? How best do I show my learning? Students will experience athletic track and perform a simple run on the track to analyze their knowledge, and students will share their experiences.































Transdisciplinary Theme:

Central idea:

The Earth's physical geography impacts human interactions and settlement.

Lines of inquiry

•Variability of physical geography around the world.

 The relationship between location and settlement.

•Responsibility of human interaction on the physical environment.

Key concepts:

change, connection , responsibility

Related concepts:

geography, settlement, and relationship

Unit of Inquiry:

In the month ahead the students will inquire into the transdisciplinary theme where we are in place and time. They will explore about variability of physical geography around the world and how it impacts human interactions and settlements.







Transdisciplinary Language: Students will list down the of their character traits role model and will also learn different types of words about like homophones and compound words.

Transdisciplinary Math:

Students will explore the concept of time line. They will explore and interpret data using bar graphs, word problems, simple operations, Bar graph, **Hindi**: Students will be introduced to choti ee ki matra through the medium of interactive learning engagements and several pictures to assist in visualization. They will also learn about the matra through videos and class discussion.

French:

Students will learn to introduce others, letters of the alphabet and the numbers from 50 to 70 in French. They will participate in interaction and enhance their anguage skills to facilitate their daily communication in French.







Spanish :

Students will be learning about fruits and months of year, The body parts, family members, greeting's part (2) with the dialogue allowing them to collaborate with some activities, express themselves in Spanish and reflect using these axes.

Telugu:

In the following month students will be introduced to the 'e' sign by listening to a story and 'u,oo' signs through learning engagements such as predicting the next part of another story.

Music:

Upcoming lessons in August

Element of music – Rhythm. The students will explore musical warm-up games designed to understand the Rhythm

- <mark>1. Dha, D</mark>hi, Dhe, Dho
- 2. D O W N and that's the way you get down
- 3. Telling names in Rhythm

Students are going to be introduced to the Saptha swaras

Students are going to explore one of the Tala's in Carnatic music –Aadhi

Students are going to learn the song as well as compose musical pieces using the elements they explored earlier.

Art:

Students will look at a picture / art work made using ONLY Lines. They will identify the lines- straight / diagonal / slanting/ horizontal/ vertical etc.

They also define a line. They will use this element of art- line to draw a picture – it can be from real life / object etc. Students will share their art work and their peers will give them feedback.

PE:

Students will list out the physical activities which they participated in, seen, or heard about. They will explore pre-athletics (running, jumping). Students will come with the word -race (start, speed, distance, finish). They will make connections with Math and science.







Drama:

Students will work on the following areas demonstrating the attribute of a thinker for the month of August.

Characterization-Identifying characteristics in a performance and portray a character.

Dance:

For the upcoming month students will watch a video of a dance performance for about 2- 3 minutes and share – what did they notice – costumes, hands, legs, expressions? They will further be asked to follow the foot work of the teacher and later move with a peppy musical number. They will reflect on their feelings to the music
