How does it work?

Touchscreens work using electricity. The screen is made of glass, an insulating material – it cannot carry an electric current. 


Empathizing and Defining the Problem-STEAM Class






Math-O-Magic








Principal's Session on Artificial Intelligence

Understanding what artificial intelligence is, is not enough until you know how it comes into play. If we can replicate the structure and the function of the human brain, we might be able to get cognitive capabilities in machines; this is the field of neural networks. If these networks are more complex and more in-depth and we use those to learn complicated things, that is the field of deep learning. There are different types of deep learning and machines that are fundamentally different techniques to replicate what the human brain does. Our Principal, Ms Shalini Singh Hamilton, in a session, enumerated how the knowledge of Artificial Intelligence is integrated in our curriculum to make the students future ready






Student Council 2022-23
