People tend to buy things when they go on sale, even if they wouldn't normally buy that item, even at the sale price. Economics helps correct these fallacies by teaching sound decision making. Additionally, it will allow you to better understand the world around you, including how businesses and governments operate.

Economics, at its very heart, is the study of people. When you study economics you gain a toolkit of skills, approaches and ways of thinking that you can apply to a wide range of problems.

It helps in developing specific skills like communication, numeracy, problem-solving, analytical skills. These help in choosing your career prospects too.

There are many fields within the broad discipline of economics, including labour, health and urban economics, economic history, economics and the law, monetary and financial economics, economic development, international trade, and environmental and natural resource economics.

Last but not the least in terms of new employment areas, economists would be well prepared for roles in 'Big Data'. This is a new field and is about analysing large volumes of data to identify patterns, and so help businesses or governments make better decisions. Holistic Excellence - Journey of ESS

Environmental Systems and Societies (ESS) is an interdisciplinary course offered only at standard level (SL). ESS is firmly grounded in both a scientific exploration of environmental systems in their structure and function, and in the exploration of cultural, economic, ethical, political and social interactions of societies with the environment. As a result of studying this course, students will become equipped with the ability to recognize and evaluate the impact of our complex system of societies on the natural world.



The interdisciplinary nature of the DP course requires a broad skill set from students, including the ability to perform research and investigations, participation in philosophical discussion and problem-solving. The course requires a systems approach to environmental understanding and promotes holistic thinking about environmental issues.

The students are supposed to do an Individual Investigation which is a written report (2250 words) of a research question designed and implemented by the student.

The facilitator explicitly teaches thinking and research skills such as comprehension, text analysis, knowledge transfer and use of primary sources. The students are encouraged to develop solutions at the personal, community and global levels.

Peer teaching, peer correction and giving feedbacks is encouraged in the class.

The students get an opportunity to participate in the Group 4 project. It is a collaborative activity where students from different group 4 subjects, within or between schools, work together. It allows for concepts and perceptions from across disciplines to be shared while appreciating the environmental, social and ethical implications of science and technology.

ATL Skills covered are: Thinking Skills, Communication Skills, Social Skills, Self- Management Skills and Research Skills.

Taking care of nature is the need of the hour. And to protect nature, one needs to know how the system works. A student of ESS should not only act as a Steward but should inspire the people around them to take up Stewardship, protect and conserve what we are left with.

Students worked on the poster of Anti-Bullying and created unique slogans to promote mental wellbeing and practice it as part of essential agreements in the classroom. Outcome of the session is to understand that prevention of bullying is a social responsibility, and each student is responsible to practice it as part of their core value.

It is seen that low teacher wellbeing can negatively affect students too. Especially stressed or burnt-out teachers have poorer relationships with students and the quality of their teaching suffers. Hence understanding the severity of the consequences, the mental wellbeing of teachers has always been taken care of at The Gaudium which is also in line with our happy minds model.

The teachers of Middle and High school attended a session on teachers' mental wellbeing on 22nd September, 2022. The aim of the session to destress the fears and understand the challenges and overcome it through mindful exercises. The First technique was progressive muscle relaxation where all teachers participated. The second technique was a fun destress activity. The teachers were asked to inflate a balloon and write down their fears they came up with in this term. 






Parent Orientation - The Digital native Parents:Gen Z

A college application is the process through which students apply to enter a college or university. The application has many important components. Students get a chance to show the reader who they are and why they would want you on their college campus. Your activities highlight your interests and your tendency to take a lead in them. Accurate applications demonstrate care and thoroughness. Although specific details vary by country and institution, applications generally require basic background information about the applicant, such as family background, and academic or qualifying exam details such as grades in secondary school and standardized testing scores. There are multiple parts to a completed admissions application, and each college requires something slightly different. Included below is a comprehensive list of what could be required in an application, along with who will often be required to make the submission.

Application Submission by the Student: Application, Personal Information, College Application Essay, Entrance Test Scores, Extracurricular and Cocurricular Activities, Summer Activities, and the Application Fee.

Submission by the Guidance counselor: Letter of Recommendation, Transcripts from grade IX- Till date.


The application process is different for each country. For USA, Common Application/ Coalition App and for UK, UCAS Application and for Canada: OUAC Application...

The title that garnered most attention was about the aspect of replicability in knowledge. How indispensable in areas like Natural Science and Mathematics but quite questionable in Arts! Teachers had tumultuous discussions and every of our utterings were saved on charts which would later be shared with the students.
