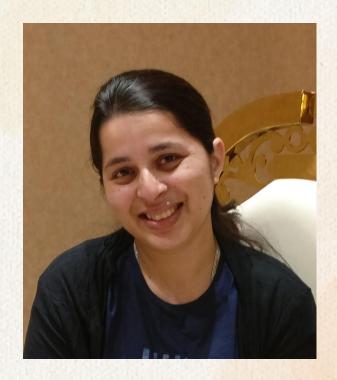
Message from the PYP Coordinator's Desk


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Global Leadership

IB Learner profile: Inquirers, Communicators, Balanced

Unit of Inquiry:

Students started their inquiry into the unit about journey. Students had a prior knowledge assessment on the term journey using Frayer model. Students defined the term journey with its examples and non-examples.

They then found out the meaning of journey using a dictionary and described various types of journey.

Students continued their inquiry about various choices made during a journey and how we involve in planning before and during a journey.









Transdisciplinary Language:

Students made trans-disciplinary connections with nouns, verbs. adjectives, prepositions and tenses bv describing about their journey that they experienced.

Students sorted the given words to nouns, verbs and adjectives. They also framed sentences using prepositions and changed given verbs to past, present and future tense forms.


They continued with the spelling assessments. They practiced reading and writing sight words, phase 4 and phase 5 words of Jolly phonics to enhance their vocabulary and grammar.

Transdisciplinary Math:

Students made trans-disciplinary connections to calendar and how they plan their journey based on the weeks and days of the month They shared about different events that they plan in a year like birthdays, important holidays etc.

Students also made connections to time which is considered while planning a journey. Students shared various facts about time and were introduced to hour hand, minute hand and 0 clock.

Various mental Math concepts were also reinforced such as problem solving, addition with regrouping, odd and even numbers etc.









French:

Students learned colours using fruits and vegetables in French.

Spanish:

Students learned fruits, vegetables and classroom objects.

Telugu:

Students learnt to read and write words using Ta vargam. They learnt new action rhymes and framed simple sentences in Telugu.

Hindi:

Students were introduced to the letters त वर्ग (त ,थ ,द ,ध ,न). They listened to a story based on these letters and later discussed the answers to their questions.

Drama:

Students worked on annual day production. They enacted and identified the emotion of the character/s in the annual day performances.

Students learnt and implemented timing of dialogue delivery as well as blocking of the script on stage.

Music:

Students learned the songs for annual day production. They learnt the songs - swagatham, chali pawan, and aao milkar and prepared for the choir performance.







Dance:

Students prepared and participated in Annual day production. They were introduced to new dance forms – Bhangra and Garba.

PE:

This month students started their inquiry on basketball through a task sheet and practiced ball control.

Art:

Students continued inquiring into various elements of art. They found out about various textures and created different textures. Students shared the importance of textures in art and how we can combine various elements of art while creating an artwork.





































































Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

Transdisciplinary Theme:

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
Unit of Inquiry:

Students will discuss the meaning of change, opportunities, and choices.

They will find out the meaning of impact and find out about the impact of journey will be on people

Students also will inquire about the term change and what changes around us. They will then find out about the changes that happens due to journey.

Students will connect to the key concepts form, function, perspective and change during the inquiry. They will also find out the meaning of opportunities and consequences.









Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

Transdisciplinary Language:

Students will describe pictures related to journey. They will be involved in show and tell where they will share about their experiences during a journey. They will continue learning about frame tenses and sentences/paragraphs usina tenses. Students will also find out the verbs and its tenses form in ORT books.

Transdisciplinary Math:

In Math, students will explore the usage of time. They will read clocks to 'O' clock and half past. make Students will also connections to map reading, directions and distance which are important factors that are considered while planning a Students journey. will be introduced to standard units of measurement such as cm, km, miles etc.

Hindi:


The students will learn the names of fruits in Hindi and will practice writing and speaking the letters of the प वर्ग (प,फ,ब,भ,म) in the class.

French

Students will learn animal names and body parts in French. They will interact and build language skills for their daily communication in French.

Spanish:

In the month of January 2023, they will revisit numbers up to 30 and learn the vocabulary of the body parts in Spanish. They will interact and build language skills for their daily communication in Spanish.









Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

Telugu:

Students will be introduced to vowels in Telugu. They will frame words and sentences using vowels.

Music:

Students will continue practicing songs learnt during Annual day. They will explore pitch and its different contexts in music.

Art:

Students will explore paper folding and stamping techniques by using objects around them and inquire about these art forms.

PE:

Students will watch videos/images related to different basic skills in basketball like dribbling, passing (Chest, overhead and bounce pass). They wll then the with practice same techniques.

Drama

Student will identify an emotion from a video. They will choose any 3 emotions and share how they show them through their expressions.

Dance

Students will watch videos of dance movement - locking. They will then learn the leg and hand movements for the new dance style.
