Unit of Inquiry:

Under the Transdisciplinary Theme "Who we are", students discussed about the meaning of role models.

They had group discussions on what they would like to know about role models. The students enthusiastically shared their role model and what makes them their role model after inquiring into their lives.

They also discussed ways they can be also be role-models to others.









Transdisciplinary Language:

Students made connections with homophones. They connected to the words 'roll' and 'role'. They realised that they both sound same but their spellings and meanings are different. They found the meaning of the word homophones using dictionary. Students shared many examples of homophones that they could connect from their daily observations.

They made connections with homonyms as the word 'role' has two different meanings. They differentiated between homophones and homonyms.

Students described their role models using describing words and made connection with Character traits.

French:

Students learnt the vocabulary related to house and started using small phrases for the same.

Spanish:

Students revisited the classroom objects, fruits and vegetables. They learned the vocabulary related to the household things.

Transdisciplinary Math:

Students made transdisciplinary connections with the collection, recording and representation of data. They understood that data can be collected, organized, displayed and analyzed in different ways.

Students also made connections with the timeline while reading books on their favourite role-models.

continued They practice multiplication as they practiced 2-digit multiplication and word problems. Students also practised "Mental math" different using resources.

Hindi-

During the month of December, the students were introduced to the ओ की मात्रा through the story and quotes;. The students excitedly recognized the names of their peers and discussed common words that included the मात्रा . This activity also helped learners in building their thinking skills. The students also learnt to write words and build sentences using this मात्रा .









Telugu:

Students engaged in 'Show' and 'Tell'. They learned the meanings of the related words. This enabled them to create their own questions. Consonant symbols were also introduced.

Dance:

Students were introduced to two new folk dance forms - Garba & Bhangra, as a part of their annual day event.

P.E:

In the month of December students explored about football and discussed about it. They were engaged in various types of physical activities while focusing on passing and running with the ball.

Music:

Elements of music - Pitch, Tune, and Rhythm

The students learned new songs with proper pitch and rhythm for the annual day according to the choirs they participated in. The students practiced -

- Aao milkar geet sunaye.
- Chali Pawan.

They also attempted to sing the song "What a wonderful world" independently with a karaoke track.









Art

Students were shown a few artworks and asked to identify the space in art. They defined the word "space", shared where they have heard this word before and how is it used?

Students were shown samples of artwork, their background, foreground, and middle ground as well negative and positive spaces. They were asked to name them and then read the actual names.

Students created 2 images to show negative and positive spaces around them.

Drama:

Students worked on the following areas for the month of December in their annual day production.

Students enacted and identified the emotion of the character /s in the annual day performance.

Students learnt and implemented timing of dialogue delivery on stage and blocking of the script on stage.































Unit of Inquiry:

The students will continue to inquire into the character traits of their role models. They will discuss the reasons for choosing a role model. They will discuss and understand the terms like values and beliefs, differences between them and how they affect people's choices and actions they take.

Transdisciplinary Language:

In the coming month, students will make transdisciplinary connections with nouns, adjectives, character traits, facts and opinions. They will write the character traits of their chosen characters. They will read and reflect on the biographies and autobiographies of different people.

Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

Hindi:

In the month ahead, students will be introduced to the matra, '31'. They will also learn how to write letter and construct words using this matra. Students will learn to frame sentences using the matra.

French:

In the month of January 2023, they will recall all the previously learned vocabulary using phrases like "C'est un-this is a, C'est une - this is a, Ce sont des- these are some, C'est le -This is the , C'est la-this is the , C'est I' - This is the, Ce sont les - These are the, Je veux-I wat, Tu veux -You want, J'ai- I have, Tu as- You have, Je vois- I see, Tu vois- You see, Je suis- I am, Tu es- You are," understand the definite and indefinite articles. Thev will demonstrate their literacy skills as they communicate daily in French.

Spanish:

In the month of January 2023, they will continue to learn the vocabulary related to house and body parts in Spanish. They will demonstrate their literacy skills in their daily communication of Spanish.

Telugu:

While reciting the poem in the month of January, they will learn the meanings of new words in it. They will learn the important words and their opposites from a story.

Music:

Students would explore vowel singing using dynamics and different rhythm. They would revise the annual day songs. Students will explore musical instruments (wind, string, and percussion). They would continue learning the French song.









Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

Drama:

Students will work on the areas like -Voice modulation in acting, Dialogues with different moods and in turn demonstrate the attribute of a thinker for the month of January.

Dance:

Students will watch a dance video of a new style (locking). They will learn hand movements and leg movements for the dance style.

PE:-

Students will be learning football dribbling this month. They will also be engaged in various types of physical activities, while focusing on dribbling using in-foot and out-foot in different directions.

Art::

Students will look at pictures of cave art form from India and list down the characteristics of the cave art. They will look at the figures, theme, colour / medium used. They debate aboutwhy is it called 'cave art" and when do they think is the time period. Using the same characteristics. students will be given 4 situations from real life and asked to choose any one and draw using the elements of cave art.

Students will look at- 5 pictures of Warli art and guess -. What? Why? How? Where? They will identify the features of Warli painting They will look at the figures, theme, colour / medium used.

They will debate- why is it called 'Warli Art" and when do they think is the time period of Warli Art

Using the same characteristics, they will draw a picture of what they see from their window.
