We witnessed an enthralling presentation of skills of our students during the annual day which emphasized on values of relationship, co-operation and were depicted with meaningful life lessons. It was the result of continuous planning, training, and cooperation by all the members of school community focusing on the creativity and collaboration of students.

While presentation skill was the highlight, students were also busy inquiring about different lines of inquiry related to the unit. In connection with the current unit of inquiry, our Grade 1 students used Design Thinking to identify potential problems around them and find solutions demonstrating their imagination and creativity.

Students of Grade 2 inquired into challenges associated with a choice of material, during its manufacture or while processing and with the by-products.



They used the Design Thinking process to come up with innovative solutions and prototype to overcome the challenges identified.

The process of empathizing to understand the problem, defining the problem, ideating, creating the prototype, builds the necessary skills for students to look at a problem with a new perspective and become problem-finders and problem-solvers.







It's a collaborative process of learning which requires support from peers, teachers as well as parents. At home, you may discuss the problem your child has identified as a part of design thinking process and extend help as they research while gathering information to understand the problem better.

Students discussed the attributes of learner profile and made real life connections.







Unit of Inquiry: Transdisciplinary Theme:

Sharing the planet Central Idea:

Animals and people interact in different ways in different contexts. .

Lines of Inquiry:

Unit of Inquiry:

Students continued inquiring about different roles of various animals in our day to day lives. They enjoyed exploring the features of camel, cow, hen, fish and horse by using different resources like pictures, stories and jamboard etc. They were able to reflect their knowledge by sharing their experiences with their peers.

Students shared the responsibility towards animals by giving them food, water and providing shelters to protect them. They also had a guest talk, wherein they connected their learning about how to take care of animals.

Transdisciplinary Language:

Students had reinforcement of letters of the alphabet- h, d, r, m, c, k and e with their phonic sounds and objects related to it. Students enthusiastically participated in various learning engagement like tearing and pasting of paper for the formation of the letters which enhanced their fine motor skills.

Dance:

Students learned elements of dance (Action) like nod, shake, hand swing, knee lift, clap, roll and body postures.

Transdisciplinary Math:

Students had reinforcement of numbers 7,8, 9 and 0. They learnt counting the number of objects in a set, oral quantification, number formation and tracing of numbers. Students were engaged in various learning engagements which developed their fine motor skills. They have begun to arrange numbers in a sequence from 5 to 1 connecting with the concept of big to small.

Drama:

Students watched two different videos and guessed the expression- angry. They made the expression- 2 things - they looked at the pictures and identified whether they were angry or not.








PE: Students learnt how to hop from one place to other place which helps them to improve their balance, take-off and landing skills. Hopping on the straight path which helps them to focus on the path and balance their self.

Music: Students listened to Happy music. They revisited 'If you are happy, I am Happy songs.

Students were introduced to Jingle Bells song by the teacher using Electronic Keyboard as a resource. **Art:** The students continued exploring shapes by identifying the objects around them.

They have started exploring the importance of shapes by using the shapes to create artworks for the Thanksgiving Day and Christmas.


































Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead


Unit of Inquiry:. Students will begin with the new unit - who we are, and explore about their identity, different relationship and responsibility towards family.

Transdisciplinary Language:

Students will learn letters of the alphabets with phonic sound and related objects. They will practice tracing and formation of letters. Students will build their vocabulary further through different learning engagements.

Transdisciplinary Math:

Students will revisit quantification, identification, formation and tracing of numbers learnt so far.









Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

Music: Students will be introduced to Ten Little Indians song and sing along with the teacher using Electronic Keyboard as a resource.

Drama: Listen to the situation, which has a problem- how will you act if you are character in the situation. Listen to a second situation- which has a problemhow will you act if you are in the character in the situation.

Art: The students will continue to further explore about different shapes and their importance in their daily life and in the art. **PE**:Students will learn some hopping skills like Hopping on straight and zig-zag paths. Balancing exercises (standing on single leg, single leg raises, balancing by single hand and leg raise etc.)

Balancing different objects like balls, saucer cones, T cones, bean bags, tennikoit rings, etc using their different body parts like (Head, palms, shoulders etc.)

Balancing walking toes and heel on the straight path (poly spots) which helps to improve their walking skills, coordination and balance. Balancing walk on toes and heel on zig zag path.

Dance:Students will be learning different elements of dance like different patterns of hand and leg movements, uses of prop and expression through dance.
