










Project-based learning in Grade 9: **Computing** for animation involves guiding students to plan and create their own animated projects, fostering active engagement and practical application of knowledge.

#### A Tale Untold

**H**istory is best defined as an intricate tapestry, full of threads woven over time, each representing a moment in the past. It would be impossible for one string not to complement another, for the tapestry itself would fray if even a single thread loosened.

However, not all stories of this tapis are acknowledged. Trauma enforced by historical events is, more often than not, forgotten - considered to be just a whisper in the screams and bellows of the darkest depths of mankind.

Like buried corpses, these conceded moments fester and rot; the crushing weight of these stains suffocates our hope for a better future.

One of the more melancholic strands of this fabric is the events and persecution of Japanese-Americans. The Japanese-American internment was the apogee of the United States' extremely long history of discrimination against the Asian community. The attack of Pearl Harbour, on December 7th, 1941, was a pivotal event which scarred several thousands. It was carried out by the Japanese Imperial Navy, causing America to finally precipitate into the World War. The then President of America, Franklin D Roosevelt signed Executive Order 9066, which states that "successful prosecution of the war requires every possible protection against espionage and against sabotage."

This meant that 20th-century America thought that the only way to protect themselves from horrific saboteurs was to imprison everyone they considered a public enemy, i.e., the Japanese Americans.

The internment of Japanese Americans was a very, very clear violation of their civil liberties and basic human rights. Surely, the government had concrete evidence, right?

No. This was an act driven, in part, by xenophobia.



The conditions of the internment camps were harsh, and often degrading, with inadequate supplies which to us would've been necessities. Japanese-Americans were subject to constant surveillance, and frequently had their movements restricted.

Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) was noted in almost 37% of them before 6 months of their release. The suicide rates inside the camps were nearly four times that of pre-war rates, and more than double the national rate of that time.

The corollary of being villainized by a country clearly had severe psychological side effects.

This all but proves that as the tapestry continues to be woven, not all the threads shall be vibrant and colourful. Much of history, in fact, is a dark and sombre place. The ruthless treatment of Japanese Americans is only one out of millions of situations that have fostered so much intergenerational trauma, mental stress, and anguish for legions of forgotten people. In conclusion, the story of the Japanese-American internment serves as a poignant reminder of the consequences of xenophobia and discrimination. While it is impossible to change the past, it is equally important to acknowledge and honour the untold stories and trauma of many individuals and communities who have been forgotten. It is up to each and every one of us to learn from the lessons of our shared history, honour the past and celebrate its many threads, and strive for a more equitable and just future for all. Let us continue to weave this tapestry of history with respect, empathy and understanding, so that generations to come may benefit from the rich and vibrant tapestry that is the story of humanity.


