IB and ChatGPT

The IB thinks that tools like spell checkers, translators, and calculators will all be powered by artificial intelligence (AI). Therefore, in order to ensure that students use these new AI technologies in an ethical and productive manner, we need to modify and transform our educational programmes and evaluation procedures. The IB will engage with schools to support their students on how to utilise these tools responsibly in accordance with our values of academic integrity but will not outright forbid the usage of such software.

The IB does not consider any work produced—even partially—by such tools to be the student's own. Students should be aware of this. Consequently, it must be made clear that Al-generated text, images, or other content is not.



This incredible new technology shouldn't be viewed as a danger. We must realise that it will become a commonplace tool in our life, just like calculators, translation apps, and spell-checkers, therefore we must modify and alter education to prepare students to use these new Al tools successfully and responsibly.

Teachers are expected to ensure that students will be made aware that the work produced by these technologies is not regarded as their own. Academic dishonesty would result from the submission of Al-generated work under one's own name. But that does not equate to forbidding its use.

Naturally, the teacher would have to explain why it is ethical for them to utilise AI tools but also not for the students to use them to write their assignments, but even this may make for an intriguing ethical lesson.

In the long run, AI is likely to entail that we spend more time understanding, explaining, and analysing problems rather than teaching the mechanics of communication or essay-writing. Instead of being afraid of something, we can appreciate it.

Scaffolding Academic rigor as a "Life Skill" Academic rigour refers to a certain standard of excellence that professors or teachers expect from their students. Academic achievement, like getting good grades in school can help students develop important life skills, such as time management and organization. These skills will be useful later, both in their personal lives and in careers. Academic rigour helps students also develop a sense of punctuality which is very useful in daily life as professionals.

Scaffolding Strategies Students can use to help make learning effective:

Show and tell:

The use of visual aids in learning not only makes learning easy but also enhances memory. It also creates a fun environment for the students to absorb the knowledge faster and better. This improves the memory of the students.

Tap into prior knowledge:

Students could share their hunches, experiences in their personal lives and ideas about the lesson or concept taught. This method would help in remembering the material better because of its application to personal experiences of the student. Give students time to talk! Students should be given some time to talk amongst their peers because discussion on the topic helps them verbally make sense of the material and articulate their learning. The think-pair-share, turn-and-talk, triad teams, and structured discussion should be encouraged.

Pause, ask questions, pause, review! In this interactive way, an idea is shared, and then there is a pause time given for reflection on what was shared, followed by asking a strategic question and finished by a pause again for reflection. This helps in checking the understanding of the concept by the students. Wishing you all the very best to our dear students. Always be joyful, proactive, attentive, and responsible in all that you do.


