

A Tale of Feminine Fortitude

"Because a society has no chance of success if its women are uneducated, Laila. No chance" writes Khaled Hosseini in his second book, A Thousand Splendid Suns. Authored to be indubitably heartbreaking, ATSS manages to completely and wholly absorb the reader into its wistful narrative.

Mariam, merely 15, is sent off to Kabul after a frightening turn of events, to marry Rasheed, a widowed guadragenarian shoemaker. After a few decades of what can only be described as horrifying torture, Mariam finds solace in Laila - a victim of the devastation caused by the Taliban. They develop a deep and lasting bond, a bond that does not fail either of them in times of desperate need. Mariam's maternal love for the part of her she sees in Laila - a part she had lost - is undeniably resolute, as is Laila's attachment to her newly-found mother figure, and this love allows them to cross even the most menacing of hurdles with utmost fortitude.

This pièce de resistance takes the reader on a journey through the political systems of late 1900s Afghanistan, gently guiding one through the absolute patriarchy of the Taliban. Hosseini touches upon topics that were previously normalized - female objectification, assault and domestic abuse - topics that we are recently seeing more and more advocation for. It would be a mistake to not mention the overwhelming amount of feminism put forth, for it is clearly visible in his writings that the author sees no point in society if it is not an egalitarian one.

The way Hosseini has weaved this tragically hopeful chronicle is... beautiful.

Simply beautiful, for I am afraid that any other word might stain the impression that this treasure should make on you. The startling realisations that he lets you in on and the ease with which he crosses over to completely different settings without, at any point, making it seem abrupt is wildly admirable. As Daily Telegraph puts it, Hosseini has a "Dickensian knack for storytelling," and that is nothing if not true.

"And the past held only this wisdom: that love was a damaging mistake, and its accomplice, hope, a treacherous illusion."

Dear reader, you now must forgive me for not ending this review with a star or point-based rating. You must also understand my inability to do so, for this masterwork of a book deserves more than what I can offer. All I can do is wholeheartedly ask you to lend your time to this brilliant portrayal of feminine tolerance and mettle. I have not regretted it, and you too, I promise, will not.


Fieldtrip to Zoo- a great way for grade 6 students to observe animals and feel a connection with wildlife.

The IC3 is a volunteer-based organization, and is renowned for its systems-based solution approach. Through their expertise, they train human resources in career and college counseling and provide access to a repository of remote training, mentoring, and professional development resources. Additionally, the IC3 Institute serves as a think tank and thought leader in the field of global higher education and career readiness, fostering expert collaborations and conducting timely research.

Mr. Ganesh Kohli, the founder of IC3, spoke about finding a purpose as educators and students. Through the career and college counseling laboratory, the program explored how each stakeholder might find purpose in school. The session's outcomes included school connections, removing boredom from schools, addressing discipline and attention span issues, finding a job and college, selecting school activities, and so on.

Reflection on IC3 session

Before the assembly on July 19th, I never knew about the IC3 organization, so I went into it with a blank slate, and it was a memorable experience for me. From what I gathered, The IC3 Institute is a volunteer-based organisation that supports high schools worldwide with guidance and training resources for solid career and college counselling departments.

The event commenced with a speech by the guest speaker, Mr. Ganesh Kohli. He began with this: "You can be poor and become rich, you can be rich and become poor, but once you're an engineer, you are an engineer, and once you are a doctor, you are a doctor, and there's no changing that." This statement instantly stuck with me for the next coming days.

Mr. Ganesh discussed how the current generation chooses careers based on competition and popularity rather than their true interests and talents. He humorously pointed out that many adults now feel like they work all week just to enjoy the weekend's fleeting joys. His storytelling prowess came to the fore when he shared an incident from his last visit to Hyderabad, where he met a dentist who expressed regret over his career choice. The dentist confided, "Sir, for five years, I have had to look at people's ugly stinky teeth, and I am sick and tired of it; I want to study hotel management now." Mr. Ganesh wished the dentist good luck, but he made a profound observation – perhaps if the dentist had explored his true passions earlier in life and had peeked into some of his schoolmate's teeth, he wouldn't be feeling this way now. While Mr. Ganesh's words were entertaining, they also struck a chord with many of us. It's true; so many people regret not pursuing what they are genuinely passionate about or what they perceive to not be an option. We often hear that it's never too late to change careers, but the regrets of missed opportunities linger, and tons of lost time feels wasted. The choices we make today shape our futures, and making the right decisions early on can save us from the pain of wanting to turn back time – an impossible feat, like pigs soaring through the summer sky.

Mr. Ganesh emphasized that one can make a career from anything they love. Whether it's combining a passion for food and photography to become a food stylist or pursuing a career in sleep studies for those who adore sleep, or being a demolition expert if you are fascinated by destruction, his point was clear – our unique interests and talents can lead us to careers we look forward to every day.

In conclusion, the IC3 assembly left a lasting impression on me. Mr. Ganesh's insightful anecdotes and motivational words urged us to contemplate our career choices more deeply. It reminded us that we should not be swayed solely by external influences or pressure but should listen to ourselves within and embrace the paths that align with our true passions. As we move forward, let us not be afraid to explore, be true to ourselves and discover our authentic selves, for it is within this journey that we can find the keys to a fulfilling and purposeful life- one that lets us leave a mark on this world.







Virtual Session with MCA Officials - Grades 9 & 10
