







Planning a Party




Topic- Earth in the solar system Activity- pair


Experiential learning




Online Classes

ICT skills

ICT skills are abilities that help students understand and operate a wide range of technology software. This can include helping students with tasks on computers, such as making video calls, searching on the internet.

Grade VI -Students learning The Hypertext Markup Language or HTML which is the standard markup language for documents designed to be displayed in a web browser. Students are understanding the meaning and structure of web content. Students used technologies such as Cascading Style Sheets and scripting languages such as JavaScript to create webpages.











Experienced Learning using LEGO EV3 Mindstorms

The learners from Grade 6 were introduced to the EV3 Mindstorms kit which is user friendly and a do-it-yourself kit. The learners have done extensive research about the kit, found various electronics and mechanical components in the kit, and how to identify each component and function of the components in the kit. They explored and understood the use of each component and constructed the basic robots and programmed them to move different directions using a GUI (Graphical user interface) based programming platform. The learners showed so much interest and excitement to build the robots using LEGO and to give a life to them artificially through programming.









Refractive Index of Glass slab

The students of Gaudium Class XII were investigating to find the refractive index of a given glass slab. For this they had to explore the construction and working of traveling microscope. They had to adjust the height of the microscope to find their observations clear and distinct. They had enjoyed the investigation and successfully found the refractive index of the glass slab.




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AI XI Pixel Art

Projectile Motion:(Babubali and Neeraj Chopra) Physics Facilitator: Ranjith Kumar Kasarla Class: XI B

To introduce the concept of projectile motion Physics the students of Gaudium XI B were given an opportunity to watch the clip of Babubali 2 movie, where the hero Prabhas tries to reach the top of the Fort with his soldiers. He uses a palm tree to do that. Palm tree is being bent up to a certain angle so that on releasing the tree Prabhas along with his soldiers flies in air in a parabolic bath and jumps onto the fort. Here while they fly in air, they possess projectile motion, where the student has to focus on the shape of the path they fly. Students were being asked questions and they had to find the factors on which the hero Prabhas had to focus to reach the top of the fort. From their answers the topic Projectile motion is developed further. Apart from movies, even sports and games were taken to demonstrate projectile motion. The students were given an example of Javelin throw where our Indian player Neeraj Chopra who won Gold medal in the last Olympics by throwing the Javelin through a distance of 87.58 m. The students were made to explore the factors that helped Neeraj Chopra to throw the javelin.








Cultivating a Reading Culture: A Successful Reading Program in Our School


Fostering Creativity and Intellect: T-Shirt Painting, Fireless Cooking, and Debate Competitions in Our School
