


Message from Head of School



Grade 9 students delve into hands-on physics experiments during their **science practical sessions**, enhancing their understanding through interactive learning experiences.















Administering **Term 2 Examinations** to evaluate student progress and understanding in the ongoing academic term.












Core Values

Unite for a collective **class assembly**, fostering a sense of community and shared experiences.








