Unit of Inquiry:

Students continued to inquire under the theme Where we are in place and time. They discussed about reasons about keeping or discarding an artifact. They reflected on their learning and shared it through endof-unit assessment. Further students started inquiry under the theme sharing the planet. Students inquired into different ways they respond to challenges, risks and opportunities. They shared the meaning of the word 'respond' and 'react' in their own words. Later, they discussed the word organization and watched various videos of organizations that support children and protect their rights across the world.

Transdisciplinary Language:

Students explored the meaning of responding and reacting through various scenarios. They further worked on enhancing their reading skills by learning to read words with phonic rules. Students worked on their writing skills and practiced framing simple sentences along with appropriate use of punctuation, prepositions, and sentence structure.

Transdisciplinary Math:

Students connected to the concept of time during the unit of inquiry and enjoyed learning to read time by practicing the concept of o'clock. They practiced reading the time using AM and PM.







They were also introduced to money and additional problem-solving skills using money while discussing challenges, risks, and opportunities.

Art

Students worked in groups and chose a story to create the stick puppets. They further explored the types of art using clay modeling.
Students made basic shapes and joined them to make clay models.
They co-constructed the task and criteria to show their learning for the assessment task. Students revisited the concepts learned and practiced colouring and drawing skills.

Drama

Students revisited the expressions and emotions. They practiced role play and enacted using the given role. Students revisited various role plays and shared their understanding of the elements of the performance.

Music

Students practiced vocal exercises with warm-ups in different scales/pitches and different tempos/speeds. Students revisited musical notes and revisited songs Happiness is Something. They were introduced to new songs Hello Bonjour and I Have a Dream and school prayer.

Dance

Students explored angry and happy emotions through facial expressions and body movements. Students learned freestyle dance movements.

PE

Learners inquired about different YOGA poses. They explored and practiced Tree pose, Child pose, Warrior pose, and Butterfly pose. They discussed striking and practiced basic movement of striking and the usage of single-hand striking as well.


