Under the guidance of design teachers Ms. Preeti and Ms. Chandana Priya, **Grade 10** students had the opportunity to delve into the intricate workings of advanced manufacturing technology. They closely observed the detailed process of **3D printing**, gaining insights into how the printer builds objects layer by layer. Additionally, the students watched the **3D laser cutter**, learning about its precision and versatility in cutting and engraving materials. This hands-on experience provided them with a deeper understanding of these cutting-edge tools and their applications in design and manufacturing.



Grade 6 students conducted an experiment to observe the reaction between carbon dioxide and lime water. They monitored the changes and documented the results.

Grade 8 students performed an iodine test to identify the presence of starch. They observed the color changes and recorded their findings





Students are having their height and weight measured as part of a **health checkup**. This routine assessment helps monitor their growth and overall health.














