The Approaches to Learning (ATL) skills are seamlessly integrated into daily teaching and learning practices to ensure holistic development. Critical and creative thinking skills are fostered through class discussions, problemsolving activities, and project-based learning, encouraging students to analyze, evaluate, and innovate.

Research skills are honed through library time, research projects, and digital literacy lessons, teaching students to gather and assess information effectively. Communication skills are developed via classroom discussions, oral presentations, literacy centers, and storytelling exercises, enhancing both verbal and written expression. Social skills, such as collaboration and conflict resolution, are emphasized through group work, peer feedback, role-playing, and classroom agreements. Self-management skills, including organization and emotional regulation, are cultivated through the use of wellbeing sessions, established routines, mindfulness activities. Inquiry-based learning and a student-centered approach underpin the curriculum, integrating these skills across various subjects and ensuring continuous assessment to support and monitor progress.

We would like to congratulate the participants of the All India Gymnastic Competition (Gymquinn 24). Three students from the NNK campus participated and won accolades for their skills. Mindfulness & Well-Being

Mindfulness is "paying attention" to the purpose in the present moment. It supports happiness and emotional balance. We would like to share valuable insights and engaging activities focused on cultivating mindfulness in our learners from Nursery.





Learners practiced mindful breathing techniques such as five-star breathing, breath in/breath out, and mindful walking. They enhanced their awareness of the five senses by practicing mindful exercises, such as listening to sounds and feeling textures. Mindfulness exercises help learners develop emotional intelligence, enhance concentration, and foster apositive mindset.

Core value

The Core value for the month of July was 'Respect' which helped in nurturing a positive and inclusive environment. Learners watched stories and rhymes related to the Core value "Respect". Facilitator narrated storied related to the core value 'Respect' and they discussed ways to show respect towards the people around them.

During the Self-Awareness sessions, the facilitator discussed various emotions that help students in social development. Students were able to identify emotions such as happiness, sadness, and anger. These sessions helped the students experience, regulate, and express their emotions.

Unit of Inquiry

It was a great month of learning and singing rhymes like '5 Little Ducks,' '5 Little Monkeys,' 'Finger Family,' 'Wheels on the Bus,' 'Where is Thumbkin, etc. Students enjoyed listening to different stories. They tuned into the unit of inquiry about families under the transdisciplinary theme of 'Who We Are.' As part of the provocation, they shared details of their family members using a photograph and explored the word 'family.' They also identified big and small families and shared the similarities and differences between them. Further, students inquired about joint families and families with pets. Through stories and role play students delved further into the unit.







Students practiced narrating the stories using the stick puppets which were made by them.

Transdisciplinary Language:

Students were engaged in picture talk, they shared about their favourite colour, toy and food enhancing their vocabulary. Students practiced various pincer grip activities such as painting, tearing, pasting, crumpling the papers which enhanced their fine motor skills.

They were introduced to the letter 's' through a story, action, jingle, flash cards, sand tracing and group learning engagement.

Students reinforced the letter sound using jolly phonics and they shared examples of the things that begin with letter 's' sound. They practiced the formation of the letter 's' using various learning engagements.

Transdisciplinary Math:

Students practiced the strokes standing line, sleeping line during their settling period.
Students were introduced to number '1' along with its quantification through various learning engagements. They were engaged in playing games to improve their handeye coordination skills likebowling and matching activities.







Students were engaged in group learning and made number collage enhancing their fine motor and social skills. Students were introduced to the number formation through air, chalk, flour and sand tracing. Further students explored about quantification and practiced number 1 quantification using objects and manipulatives.

Music:

Students were introduced to different sounds like baby crying, phone ringing, clapping, kids laughing, birds chirping, rain, loud horn, vehicles moving. This helped in sensorial development among kids.

Students identified the similarities and difference between noise and music. Students shared examples of the sounds from their daily life. Students watched a video related to loud sound and soft sound, identified the sounds. Later they shared examples of the soft and loud sounds. Students practiced rhymes-' Head shoulders knees and toes', 'Old mac Donald', 'Bear went over the mountain and the Farmer in the Dell.'

Art:

Students were engaged in creating artworks using clay, filled the given picture by tearing and pasting the coloured papers.

They developed social skills by creating artworks like scribbling





art in a group and coloring activities by filling the given picture with their choice of colours individually. Students observed different artworks with colour and without colour and shared their understanding about the pictures. Students were introduced to the primary colours red, yellow and blue. They identified the objects with primary colours and shared examples. Later students coloured the given pictures using the primary colours.

Drama:

Learners were introduced to storytelling by using a toy. They explored to identify the character in a toy. To enhance their creative skills students used the toy to weave a story of their choice and narrated it to the peers with teacher's support.

PE:Students were engaged in various recreational activities related to locomotor skills. They participated in running, picking, placing, throwing, and jumping over objects. Additionally, they were involved in an obstacle course that included walking, jumping, running, climbing, and crawling. Students explored the similarities and differences between walking, jogging, and running.

Dance:

Students were introduced to basic dance movements.
Later, they discussed the importance of dance in real life. Students then practiced hand and leg movements, along with a few fun dance learning activities, enhancing their gross motor skills.

Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

Unit of Inquiry:

Students will continue to inquire about the relationships and how their families influence to shape their future. Further they will explore about the responsibilities within the family members and discuss about their responsibilities as a family member.

Language:

Students will be introduced to the letters of group 1 jolly phonics – a, t, p, i and n through their phonic sounds, stories and phonic songs. They will further learn new vocabulary related to the unit.

Mathematics:

Students will continue to learn the numbers with recognition, formation and quantification through various learning engagements.

Art:

Students will further explore colours and share their importance in the artwork and in daily life.

Dance:

Students will explore learn full body movement and gestures (moving different parts of the body) such as knee lift, jump, shake, point, turns, hand roll, and nodding. They will also explore and learn free style dance movements.

Drama:

Students will learn about different types of animal and bird sounds. They will learn to identify and reproduce the animal sounds.







Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

Drama:

Students will explore different types of animal and bird sounds. They will learn to identify and reproduce the animal sounds.

Music:

Students will be introduced to Nature sounds (birds chirping, rain, wind). Students will practice the rain songs/ rhymes along with the teacher with the help of Electronic Keyboard. Students will make a choice of the song/rhyme they learnt (rain song/rhyme) and share the reasons for the choice.

PE:

Students will explore the correct technique of jogging and running. They will walk and run on the straight line, zig-zag and around the shape with proper hand and leg movements. They will explore the running skill through various activities and implement in lead up game.
