The Approaches to Learning (ATL) skills are seamlessly integrated into daily teaching and learning practices to ensure holistic development. Critical and creative thinking skills are fostered through class discussions, problemsolving activities, and project-based learning, encouraging students to analyze, evaluate, and innovate.

Research skills are honed through library time, research projects, and digital literacy lessons, teaching students to gather and assess information effectively. Communication skills are developed via classroom discussions, oral presentations, literacy centers, and storytelling exercises, enhancing both verbal and written expression. Social skills, such as collaboration and conflict resolution, are emphasized through group work, peer feedback, role-playing, and classroom agreements. Self-management skills, including organization and emotional regulation, are cultivated through the use of wellbeing sessions, established routines, mindfulness activities. Inquiry-based learning and a student-centered approach underpin the curriculum, integrating these skills across various subjects and ensuring continuous assessment to support and monitor progress.

Students shared about the various ways they can be respectful to the people around them. Mindfulness & Well-Being

Mindfulness supports happiness and emotional balance. Learners practiced five-finger star fish, breathing in and out, Hissing breathing and Bunny breathing, mindful walking, slow walking exercises related to mindful breathing and mindful movement. To enhance 5 senses awareness students were engaged in exercises related to their senses. As part of mindful thinking students practiced Gratitude jar, I am thankful for activities and Bubbles of gratitude. They discussed the importance of being thankful about the people and things around them.International Yoga Day was celebrated to raise awareness about the benefits of Yoga. Students practiced Yoga asanas.



As a part of well-being sessions, learners were engaged in various group discussions related to self-awareness. Students discussed and reflected about the importance of understanding themselves, they shared about the various emotions. Students also discussed about mindful choices in a social setting.







Global Leadership

Students discussed and coconstructed the essential agreements along with their peers to maintain conducive environment for learning and teaching. They were encouraged to take ownership of their learning which helps in enhancing the interest to learn. Unit of Inquiry:

Learners started the unit under the theme 'How we organize ourselves'. During the provocation students went for a school tour and identified different signs and symbols in and around the school. Students listened to the story called 'Runaway signs' and discussed the importance of signs and symbols in the world. Students further inquired about logos and national symbols.

Transdisciplinary Language:

In connection with UOI, learners made a transdisciplinary connection with punctuation marks, nouns and verbs.





They discussed the usage of punctuation marks while writing and practiced punctuation while framing sentences. They share examples of nouns and classified them as nouns of persons, places, animals and things.

Transdisciplinary Math:

Students revisited the concept of comparison numbers, addition and subtraction. They explored different strategies to solve the equations related to subtraction and addition. They were engaged in mental math tasks to enhance their thinking skills to memorize math facts.

Drama:

Students explored role play through various learning engagements.

PE:

Students were engaged in fitness drills and fun games focusing on locomotor skills to improve their walking, jogging and running. They explored jogging and running on the spot and on straight path. They discussed about the differences and importance of these skills.

Dance:

Students explored about the importance of dance work out and their benefits. Later they were introduced to hand and legs movements. Through various learning engagements students enhanced their understanding about body awareness, time and rhythm.





Art:

The students explored the different types of art. They used the different objects available around them to enhance their creativity by using them as stamps to create their artwork. They shared how printing can be used in art and daily life and the reasons for using the printing. Students explored the different ways paper can be used creatively in art. Further they used newspaper& colour papers to cut, paste and create their artwork.

Music:

Students were engaged in singing songs along with the teacher and identified the instruments that were played with the song.
Students watched a video related to types of voice and shared their understanding about Its usage. Students sang a song of their choice and reflected on the soft and loud sounds in the song.







Hindi:

Learners introduced themselves to their peers by sharing about their Name, hobbies, and favourite things. Learners were introduced to 'ক' letter through a presentation. Story and poem related to the letter "**ক'** and '**ৰ্ভা**' was shown. They identified and wrote the letters 'ক' and 'ख' .They also learned how words are formed by using letters. Students identified, pronounced and wrote numbers 1 to 10 in Hindi.

Telugu:

Learners introduced themselves in Telugu and shared their interests. Students were asked to identify the objects and share in Telugu. Introduction of ka,kha letters was done through flash cards. Students practiced Oral recitation of ka kha letters by storytelling activity. They learned numbers from 1-5 in Telugu.







Spanish:

Introduction of Spanish Greetings, Phonemes.

Learners practiced them orally and practiced the greetings using role play. Introduction of Numbers (1 to 20) was done using flash cards.

French:

Introduction to the French Greetings, Phonemes were introduced to the students. Learners practiced them orally & practiced greetings through role play. They saw the videos on phonemes for better understanding & pronunciation.Introduction of Numbers (1 to 10).

Compulsory Telugu:

Students were introduced to Telugu language which helps them to communicate using simple sentences in their daily routine.



Learning and Teaching-Month Ahead

Unit of Inquiry:

Transdisciplinary Theme:

How the world works

Central Idea:

All living things go through the process of change.

Lines of Inquiry:

- •Characteristics of living and non-living things
- Patterns of growth in various living things
- Effects of factors that influences lives

Key Concepts:

Form Change Causation

Unit of Inquiry:

In continuation with the current unit, students will further explore about designing signs, symbols and logos of their choice.
Students will start new unit under the theme How the world works they will inquire about the characteristics of living and non-living things, patterns of growth in living things and factors that effect their living.

TD Language:

Students will continue exploring verbs ,framing simple sentences using verbs and picture talk.

TD Math:

Students will reflect on the learning about comparison of numbers, addition and subtraction as part of ongoing assessments.





Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

Dance:

Students will learn basic steps of free style, locking and movements related to hip-hop genre. They will also learn the history and differences in these styles.

Art:

Students will inquire about primary, secondary, cool and warm colours in the elements of art. They will observe different artworks to discuss the features.

Music:

Students will be introduced to genre and tune. Students will watch a video of different pieces of music and identify the difference between different kinds of music. Students will practice singing with the teacher.

Drama:

Students will learn the usage of voice in characterization. They will explore different characters with different voice and showcase their learning in classroom demonstration.

PE:

In the coming month August, students will be engaged in running. They will inquire about the variations of running with proper hand and leg movements and its Techniques. They will explore the different variations of run like on the straight path, zig zag and shuttle run, They will understand the importance of these skills and where and how will these skills help them.





Learning and Teaching-Month Ahead

French:

In the month of August students will learn about the numbers 1 to 20. Introduction in French like Name, Age, City Name they are living in etc. They will practice Self introduction through role play, oral presentation in front of Teacher.

Spanish:

In the month of August students will learn the numbers 1 to 30. They will practice self introduction through Role-Play, also students will do oral presentation in front of teacher.

Telugu:

In the coming month August, students will learn ga gha inya letters through poem recitation, storytelling and flash cards. They will be introduced to Telugu numbers from 6-10.

Hindi:

In the coming month, August, learners will be further introduced to the letter **শ' और 'ঘ'** .They will also learn how to write the letters and form words by using these letters.
