The Approaches to Learning (ATL) skills are seamlessly integrated into daily teaching and learning practices to ensure holistic development. Critical and creative thinking skills are fostered through class discussions, problem-solving activities, and project-based learning, encouraging students to analyze, evaluate, and innovate.

Research skills are honed through library time, research projects, and digital literacy lessons, teaching students to gather and assess information effectively. Communication skills are developed via classroom discussions, oral presentations, literacy centers, and storytelling exercises, enhancing both verbal and written expression. Social skills, such as collaboration and conflict resolution, are emphasized through group work, peer feedback, role-playing, and classroom agreements. Self-management skills, including organization and emotional regulation, are cultivated through the use of wellbeing sessions, established routines, mindfulness activities. Inquiry-based learning and a student-centered approach underpin the curriculum, integrating these skills across various subjects and ensuring continuous assessment to support and monitor progress.

We would like to congratulate the participants of the All India Gymnastic Competition (Gymquinn 24). Three students from the NNK campus participated and won accolades for their skills. Holistic Excellence

As a part of holistic excellence, students engaged in read aloud sessions, listening to stories during their reading sessions. Mindfulness & Well-Being

Mindfulness is "paying attention" to the purpose in the present moment. It supports happiness and emotional balance. Learners practiced mindful breathing techniques such as five-star & breathing in/breathing out exercises and mindful walking. They enhanced the awareness of 5 senses by practicing mindful exercises like sounds they hear and textures they can feel.







As a part of well-being sessions, learners were engaged in various group discussions related to selfawareness. Students discussed and reflected about the importance of understanding themselves, they shared about the various emotions. Students also discussed about mindful choices in a social setting.

Global Leadership

Students discussed and coconstructed the essential agreements along with their peers to maintain conducive environment for learning and teaching. They were encouraged to take ownership of their learning which helped in enhancing the interest to learn. Students of PP2 presented their first assembly with confidence.

Unit of Inquiry:

Students started their first unit of inquiry under the theme 'Who are'. They explored we the meaning of relationships and understood about the of importance different relationships in a family. Τo extend their learning they watched the video of Robinson family and connected with their own family. They discussed about the relationships at home and school. Thev used concentric circles to deepen their understanding about the relationships.

Transdisciplinary Language:

In TD Language, Students practiced jolly phonics group wise letters and practiced blending the CVC words. Further they used CVC word to frame simple sentences. Students practiced sight words and understood the usage of it.




Transdisciplinary Math:

Students revisited numbers 1-100. Students were introduced to the concept of bundling to develop the conceptual understanding of place value. Later they practiced place value through various hands-on learning engagements. They practiced writing numbers using tens and ones. Students further explored comparison of numbers and ordering of numbers in Ascending and descending order.

Art

Students were engaged in creating simple paper folding crafts. Students observed different artworks and shared their understanding of what they see, think and wonder.





Drama

Students revisited the concepts learnt in the previous class like storytelling, playing with a toy etc.

Dance

Students were introduced to dance work out and its benefits. They revisited the dance movements learned in the previous year. Students were introduced to hands and legs movements. After these sessions students developed understanding about the body awareness and space.

Music

Students listened to an audio with types of voices and shared about the usage of the voices. Students were introduced to soft voice and loud voice and practiced singing songs using them. Students heard slow and fast sound and discussed the differences between them.

PE

Learners were engaged in ice breaking activities, fun games. They explored physical activities.





Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

Unit of Inquiry: Transdisciplinary Theme: How we organize ourselves Central Idea:

Relationships can have an impact on our well-being

Lines of Inquiry:

Types of relationships
Identifying and understanding reasons to have relationships
Impact of relationships on social and emotional well-Being.

Key Concept:

IB Learner Profile: Caring Principled Balanced

Unit of Inquiry:

Students will learn about roles and responsibilities within their school and community. Through various stories, they will delve into the concept of 'well-being,' focusing on how relationships affect social and emotional health. They will also begin their second unit under the theme 'How We Organize Ourselves,' exploring the concept of transport and different transportation systems.

Transdisciplinary Language:

In TD Language, Students will continue with jolly phonics groups and make CVC words. They will explore usage of sight words and will be introduced to new vocabulary.



Learning and Teaching- Month Ahead

Transdisciplinary Math:

Students will reinforce the concept of bundling and place value. Later, they will be introduced to greater than and lesser than. Students will be engaged in different learning engagements related to the operation addition.

Art:

Students will continue to explore colours by making the secondary colours using the primary colours and use them in their artwork.

Drama:

Students will explore role play and learn about different characters and roles.

Music :

Students will listen to two pieces of music, one in tune and one out of tune, and compare their similarities and differences. They will practice singing with the teacher and reflect on whether they were in tune. Additionally, students will identify a song or rhyme played by the teacher in two different pitches and discuss how they are alike and different.



Dance:

Students will be learning full body movement and gestures (moving different parts of the body) of knee lift, jump, shake, shimmy, point, turns, hand roll, and different combination of steps. They will learn free style dance.

PE: Learners will discuss on how best they can learn. They will explore about jogging and practice jogging.
