My sincere gratitude to the management for introducing the continuum path to AS & A levels, which gives a wider scope for students in high school.


May the festivities of the season endlessly fill your life with joy and foster a newfound love for learning.



Students of Grade 9 visit **T Works**, India's largest fully integrated hardware prototyping center.






