# Learning and Teaching - This Month

## Transdisciplinary Theme Where we are in place and time

**Central Idea:** Evidence of ancient civilizations facilitate people to make connections with present-day societies.

## Lines Of Inquiry:

- Characteristics of civilizations and societies
- Relationship involved in collecting, analyzing, and validation
- Connection between past, present, and implications for the future

## Key concepts:

Function, Causation, and Connection

#### **Related concepts:**

Continuity, Progress, Difference, and validity.



### Unit of Inquiry:

The students researched on how historians and archeologists gather evidences. They looked into the various methods used to analyse and validate the historical evidences. They also inquired into the importance of accurate and reliable evidences. The students reflected on how ancient civilization influence modern societies. They also gathered and reflected on lessons learned from civilizations. They also went on a field trip visit to the Telangana State archeology museum followed by a speaker who helped the quest understand students the whole process of archeology and inventions have been taken forward to our times.

The students predicted the future societal developments based on past evidences. Post their inquiry students did their end of unit assessment followed by end of reflection.



# Learning and Teaching – This month

## **Transdisciplinary Language**

The students made transdisciplinary connections with root words, homophones and homonyms in language.

The students started with their weekly spelling assessments and co-constructed the same to enrich their vocabulary.

The students have completed their Term-1 assessment In Language.

They made connections to the concepts-tenses and their types. They also co-constructed the definition and discussed the examples for the same. They will continue to work on their information report and make connections to the grammar conventions like types of nouns, pronouns and verbs.

### **Transdisciplinary Math**

The students did mental math practice every day to revisit the concepts learned. They also revisited the concepts such as addition, subtraction, multiplication, division.

The students completed their Math Term-1 assessment.

The students inquired into the different types of maps and understood the concept of scale on a map. They were able to differentiate between various types of maps (e.g., political maps, physical maps, thematic maps) and understood its purpose.

The students also learned about 2D and 3D shapes, regular and irregular polygons.



# Learning and Teaching – This month

### French

The students learned new concepts like vocabulary on professions, Masculine and Feminine forms. They also learned how to express professions of their family members or any famous personality.

## Hindi

The students were encouraged to read and share Historical stories, which serve as inspirations, showcasing the limitless potential of human achievement. They discussed various story elements during this time, including the title, characters, settings, time periods, objects, descriptive words, problems, and morals.

### Telugu

The students focused on studying adjectives by identifying the main characters in the stories. They read prose sections and describe illustrations.

## Spanish

The students learned the basic questions and their answers to ask and respond like name, age, place, languages etc. They also learn some AR verbs with conjugation concepts relating to the family or house description.

## **Compulsory Telugu:**

The Students will continue to learn letters and అం,అ: గ,ర,మ,జ,ట,న and also simple words, flower names, vegetable names, Birds names, colours and small stories in Telugu.



# Learning and Teaching – This month

#### Music

The students learned basic voice modulation Solfege exercise 1, 2, 3 and also started learning I have a dream song. They also learned how to sing modulation in a proper pitch, and melody. The students are individually practicing voice modulation.

### PE

The students started inquiry on field events (long jump) by watching the video. They explored the field events.

The students learned the techniques and steps for long jump and also gave trials for long jump.

The students did task sheets for field events and they also connected body system and lifestyle choices using a task sheet.

#### Dance

The students learned the next set of dance movements (8 count and 4 count steps) in folk dance (cinematic folk – Patriotic theme) along with music.

### **Visual Arts**

The students looked at two images of each- Altamira and Bhimbetka cave art, they recognized the style and features with timeline. They created one artwork with the choice of art style. The students read about the cave art. They also observed different artwork from the civilization and explored the timeline, its process and purpose. They discussed on the culture of civilization and created their own artwork with the same approach.





# Learning and Teaching - This month

#### Drama

The students continued working on their stories and rehearsing their plays. They documented their development in the Theatre Journal. They worked on the set, music, sound, lights, and props. They will work on stage management.

#### ICT

The students revised the basics of the computers, characteristics of the Bitcoin and Cryptocurrency, and their uses and benefits followed by the Assessment.

The students understood that Microsoft Word is a word processing software developed by Microsoft. It allows users to create, edit, and print documents, including text, images, tables and graphics.

- The students learned the following:
- -Open or create a new document

- Edit and format text, images, and graphics

- Use templates and themes for quick document creation

- Insert tables, charts, and other graphical elements

### **Unit of Inquiry**

The students will start Inquiring into the third unit of inquiry under the theme "How the world works". They will be given a provocation task to come up with words related to energy.

They will understand the meaning of the word, unpack the central idea followed by inquiring into the different types of energy and their uses.

Students will understand the meaning of transformation of energy and how it can be sustained. They will come up with different problem scenarios wherein they will connect to the design thinking process.

They will define the problem statement after discussing the root cause leading them to create their own prototype.

Students will also maintain their design thinking journal for the same.





## **Transdisciplinary Language**

While inquiring about energy and its uses, students will make connections with the report reading while exploring to research about different types of energy.

They will further find out different types of energy that can be described with the purpose of it around us, while doing this students will make connection with adjective and descriptive writing.

While inquiring into transformation of energy the students will connect to transformation that takes place in sentences. They will connect to active & passive voice and also with direct & indirect speech.

### **Transdisciplinary Math**

The students will learn essential data handling skills in math. They will begin by collecting and organizing data from surveys or experiments.

The students will explore how to represent this data using charts and graphs, such as bar graphs and pictographs. This visualization will help them see trends and make comparisons easily.

They will also learn key concepts like averages (mean), maximum, and minimum values.

The students will also inquire into factors, multiple and prime factorization along with LCM and HCF.



#### French

The students will learn how to understand and tell directions of places in the city.

### Hindi

The students will inquire about The students will poetry. be introduced to the braverv poem-"Veer tum badhe chalo". As they read, they will identify new words and find their meanings. Additionally, they will share and write down 5 main ideas or points from the poem.

The students will receive a short story or play to read and discuss in their upcoming classes.

#### Telugu

The students will continue to explore fact and opinion through an introduction to realistic adventure stories.

## Spanish

The students will learn season, weathers relating verb "Hacer "conjugation and continue to practice AR conjugation concept. They will use thinking skills and communicative skills to express their family and others in Spanish.

## **Compulsory Telugu:**

The students will continue learning letters and చ,ప,య,వ,బ, simple words and simple sentences.

### Music

The students will learn basic voice modulation, Solfege exercise 4,5 and will also learn- "I've a dream" song. They will learn how to sing with modulation in a proper pitch, and melody. The students will practice voice modulation individually in music classrooms.





#### PE

The students will start the inquiry on Shot put. The students will learn the techniques of shot put. The students will give trials for shot put.

#### Dance

The students will have an introduction to Hip Hop beginners level (Hip hop vocabulary, Uprock, Foot shuffles, Spins and turns) with music.

### **Visual Arts**

The students will work on artifacts for the Farmers Market related to Different Civilisations, Expressionism and Cubism.

#### Drama

The students will be working on the performances related to Annual Day and Theatre day. They will choose which form of folk Theatre they would like to prepare. They will make a detailed plan for it.



### ICT

The students will use the formatting toolbar to learn how to do the following in Ms-Word:

- Check spelling, grammar, and punctuation
- Export documents to various file formats
- Demonstrate alignment, spacing, and indentation for the paragraph.
- Show how to use bullets and numbering the text.
- The students will go to the ICT lab to do practicals to know more about the word.
