Core Values

10 Days of Kindness Festival

The IO days of kindness festival is an important event that promotes kindness, empathy and compassion within the community which was initiated in our school. Kindness makes people happy and the world a better place. The students said that we can show kindness or be kind by speaking politely, being supportive, helping people and motivating them every day. It was planned with different learning engagements followed by reflection.













As part of the "10 Days of Kindness Festival," Nursery students participated in various helpful activities. They eagerly took part in cleaning up their toys, assisted the Ayamma in wiping the green board, and neatly tucked in their chairs after use. The students also went around the school, thanked different people, and expressed their gratitude. They were excited about these acts of kindness and expressed a desire to continue contributing in similar ways.

Unit of Inquiry:

How we express ourselves

Central Idea: Play facilitates expression, feelings, ideas and new understandings

Lines of inquiry:

- Purpose of play
- Imaginative use of materials and objects
- The role of toys over time

Key Concepts:

Function, Connection, Change

Related concept:

Imagination, Creativity, Communication

Unit of inquiry:

The students tuned into their second Unit of Inquiry, "**How We Express Ourselves**." As part of the provocation, they had personal time in the play area and various stations, which led them to the word "**play**." They explored their feelings before and after playtime, by sharing details about who they enjoy playing with, where they like to play, and what they enjoy playing with.





Language:

Students were introduced to the letters s, a, and t from the first set of jolly phonics along with its sound and related objects using various videos, flashcards, and images. They further got an opportunity to reinforce the letters through different learning engagements like collage work, paper sticking, thumb printing, and physical games like treasure hunt, identifying the letters by jumping on the letters. Students practiced letter formation through sand tracing, using chalk, crayons and play dough, etc.

Math:

Students reinforced the oral counting of numbers 1,2 and 3 and connected their learning with real-life experiences. Students were introduced to the pre-math concept more and less. They further continued the quantification of numbers by counting different objects and manipulatives in the class.

Art

Students continued with their learning of colours. They co-constructed the assessment task and criteria and showed their learning of colors by identifying and relating colors to objects. Students used the mould to make the clay Ganesha for the Ganesh Chaturthi. As the learning process continues, the students are introduced to the different types of art printing by using different objects, such as stamps to create their artwork like bottle caps, fingers, hands, and vegetables.





Dance

The students engaged in learning various dance movements

Body isolation movements (hands, legs, and head).

Rolly polly, turn around, waving.

Drama

Students worked on the following areas demonstrating the attributes of communicators for September.

- Prediction and Sounds from the stories.
- Imitating the sounds of different animals.

PE

Our nursery students actively engage in activities carefully designed to develop their gross motor skills. Through a series of carefully selected stretching exercises, the children improve their flexibility and overall endurance. Additionally, they participated in recreational games that were not only for fun but also focused on essential physical fitness components such as speed, agility, coordination, and balance.





















































Learning and Teaching – Month Ahead

Unit of Inquiry

"How we express ourselves"

Central Idea: Play facilitates expression, feelings, ideas and new understandings

Lines of inquiry:

- Purpose of play
- Imaginative use of materials and objects
- The role of toys over time.

Key Concepts:

Function, Connection, Change

Unit of Inquiry

The students will speak about their favourite toys from school and home through a show-and-tell activity. They will also discuss the imaginative use of materials and objects, as well as how the roles of toys have changed over time.

Transdisciplinary Language

Students will build new vocabulary and identify the beginning sounds. They will associate the sounds with letters and practice the phonic sounds of the letters identified or introduced. They will also practice formation of letters and build their vocabulary through stories, picture talk etc.

Transdisciplinary Math

Students will continue to engage with oral counting of further numbers, and formation of the numbers. Students will be introduced to patterns and pictograph.



Learning and Teaching – Month Ahead

Dance

- Wide movements and use of space.
- Travel moves with wide moves.

Drama

Students will work on the following areas demonstrating the attribute of Communicators for the month of October.

- Expression- Imitating, guessing, identifying.
- Technique of creating face expressions.

Art

Students will do diya painting and also will start working on the artwork for the farmer's market.

PE

In the upcoming month, our focus will be on enhancing eye-hand coordination and concentration. Students will participate in stretching exercises and recreational games including jogging and jumping exercises. They will also enjoy the creation games such as in & out, gold mining, etc. Each session will conclude with cooling down exercises ensuring a well-rounded physical development experience.
