The students began their inquiry into the Unit of Inquiry:

"How We Express Ourselves," focusing on the central idea our experiences, thoughts, and feelings influence the way we express ourselves. They explored the first line of line of inquiry: "Exploring Different Emotions" learning various through engagements. Students investigated how emotions such as happiness, sadness, anger, and excitement are felt and expressed in different situations. Through engaging activities and hands-on experiences, they learned to identify and describe these emotions by relating them to experiences. Thev personal used role-play and drawing to express feelings, which helped them understand how emotions shape their actions and interactions

Additionally, they shared examples of how certain situations make them feel, such as how sharing toys with friends brings happiness or how losing a favorite toy can lead to sadness. This helped deepen their understanding of how emotions influence their behavior and expressions in everyday life etc.







Language:

The facilitator engaged the students in various planned learning activities that helped them learn in an interactive way. The Jolly Phonics rhymes and games were enjoyed by the students. They had an opportunity to enhance their vocabulary by identifying the beginning sounds of words for the letters Cc, Kk, and Ee. They learned words starting with each letter, such as "cat," "cup," and "car" for Cc, "kite," "key," and "king" for Kk, and "egg," "elephant," and "engine" for Ee. Through the blending technique of the sounds, they were able to create two-letter and three-letter words. They continued practicing the formation of CVC words using techniques like sand tracing, notebook practice, and play dough. Additionally, they practiced reading three-letter words using the letters S, A, T, P, I, and N. These activities effectively helped them develop their language skills and expand their vocabulary in a fun and interactive way.

Math:

The explored students the concepts of numbers before and after from 1 to 30. They reinforced their understanding of numbers with a focus on place value, bundling, emphasizing guantification sequencing. and They practiced writing numbers in their notebooks and also reinforced their understanding of tally marks. Additionally, they enhanced their comprehension of shapes by drawing them in their notebooks. Through these activities, the students were able recognize and understand different shapes, using them to express their feelings in creative and engaging ways.







Dance:

Performance responsibility and audience behavior.

Individual focus area in choreography (Body language and expression).

PE:

Our PP1 students actively engaged in activities designed to develop their gross and fine motor skills. Through selected carefully stretching exercises, the children improved their lower body strength, flexibility, and overall endurance. Additionally, they participated in recreational games that are fun and focus on essential physical fitness components such as speed, agility, and balance. These activities are instrumental in building a strong foundation for physical development, ensuring they grow strong and agile.

Drama:

Students worked on the following areas demonstrating the attribute of a communicator for September.

Prediction and Sounds from the stories.

Imitating the sounds and postures of different animals.

Art:

Students observed the demonstration of clay Ganesha using the moulds and created the clay Ganesha using the same. Students continued to explore different types of art by exploring the technique of tearing and pasting by recreating the given picture using the technique. The students created their choice artworks and recreated them using the technique of tearing and pasting. Students inquired importance of the technique. Students continued to explore the technique by arranging different material sticking them to create artworks like bindi, paper crumpling, leafs and twigs.

Unit of Inquiry:

The students began their inquiry for the new unit under the theme "How We Express Ourselves." They explored how their experiences, thoughts, and feelinas are influenced. ln the upcoming month, students will delve into the second line of inquiry: "The Role of Emotions in Expressing Ourselves." Through various engaging storytelling, activities such as role-play, emotion journals, charades, music and movement, art and craft, and group discussions, they will be able to deepen their understanding of how emotions play a crucial role in their ability to express themselves and communicate with others.







Learning and Teaching - Month Ahead

Language:

Students will explore uppercase and lowercase letters and their phonic sounds second set of jolly phonic through various learning engagements. Students will practice the formation of letters through interactive learning engagement. They will also enhance their vocabulary by learning new words and their meaning during the inquiry. Further they will revisit the concept of blending of letters to make two letter and CVC words to enhance their reading skills.

Math:

Students will explore concepts of between numbers, pictograph, reinforcement of 2D shapes and introduction to 3D shapes. They will be introduced to numbers 31 o 40 focusing on quantification, sequencing, and understanding their place value. Students will also learn about the shapes through engaging activities that enhance their shape recognition and understanding. Further they will revisit the concept of bundling and tally marks to quantify numbers.







Learning and Teaching - Month Ahead

PE:

In the upcoming month, there will be focus on enhancing hand-eye coordination, accuracy, concentration, and quick decision-making through fun and engaging activities. Students will participate in stretching exercises and recreational games, including throw-and-catch, juggling, balloon toss, and flying disc. They will also enjoy racing games which will improve their speed. Each session will conclude with cooling-down exercises, ensuring a well-rounded physical development experience.

Art:

Students will start working on artwork for the farmer's market. They will further explore different types of art like clay modeling and paper sculpting.

Dance:

Body isolation through body warm-up, body stretching and basic movements of dance which is going to help them -to perform high range of movement (locomotor- and non-locomotor) in choreography

Bounce legs movements.

Body hops.

Drama:

Students will work on the following areas demonstrating the attribute of

communicator/inquirers for the month of October.

Expression-Imitating, guessing, identifying.

Technique of creating face expressions. (Uses of eye, nose, mouth)
